Supporting the Social Involvement of Children and Young People through Democracy Education and Participation-based Model Projects (LINK HERE)

Types of Eligible Activities:

- Offering age-specific, participation-based democracy education projects for children (aged 14+) or young adults (18+)
- Fostering grassroots democratic processes for the representation of student interests within schools and beyond
- Creating networks of democratic youth groups for coordination, joint activities, and development of a shared democratic agenda
- Amplifying the voice of democratic youths through online and offline campaigns
- Amplify the voice of students in the process of education-related decision-making at school, local, regional or national level
- Enhancing the democratic and civic skills of children (aged 14+) and young adults through community-development-oriented volunteering and internship programs.

3. Ukraine: Relief, Resilience, Recovery Programme (LINK HERE)

This emergency program in response to Russia's war against Ukraine supports Ukrainian citizens, civic activists and civil society organizations, and journalists and independent media. Support is provided to civic initiatives, civil society organizations, and independent media outlets as well as targeted capacity-building measures, Ukrainian civil society networking and cooperation, and policy initiatives by Ukrainian experts and think tanks.

organizational development. Support is directed toward civil society organizations working on key issues such as:

- feminist knowledge and analysis;
- o gender mainstreaming;
- rights of women, LGBTI+ people, migrants, refugees, and asylum seekers;
- gender-based violence and domestic violence;
- media freedom and combating disinformation;
- democratic participation and fair elections;
- climate justice, social equality, labor rights, and access to justice;
- empowerment of communities in isolated and marginalized areas.

The program places a special focus on organizations whose work covers vulnerable groups, including: girls and women; people with disabilities or addictions; LGBTI+ people; refugees and migrants; women in feminized and low-paid professions; human rights





defenders, journalists, and media representatives.

Financial support can be used for a wide range of activities related to the administrative, strategic, and programmatic strengthening of organizations, including:

- team building and human resources;
- sustainable financial management;
- monitoring, learning, and evaluation;
- advocacy and participation in policy-making;
- risk management and crisis preparedness.


