

Overview

Out of 1.2 million people* who have fled their homes in Lebanon, many thousands have crossed the border from Lebanon into Syria to escape the airstrikes, including Syrians, Lebanese and others.

Jdaidet Yabous remains the primary entry point for most of the individuals crossing into Syria.

estimated Lebanese** arrived in Iraq (between 23 Sep and 05 Nov 2024)



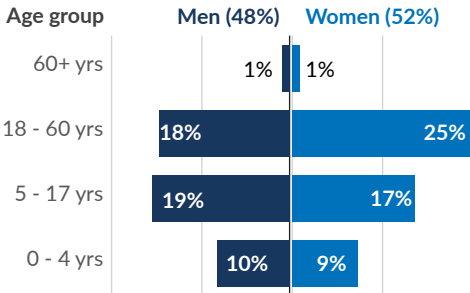

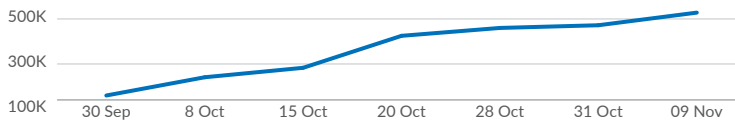
(Individuals newly arrived in Syria)



Arrivals in Syria

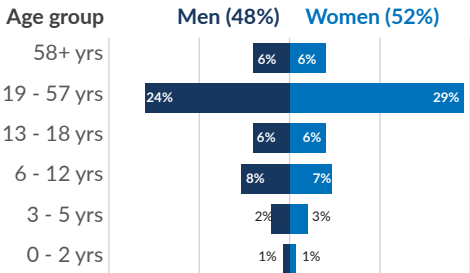


Cumulative arrivals trend in Syria

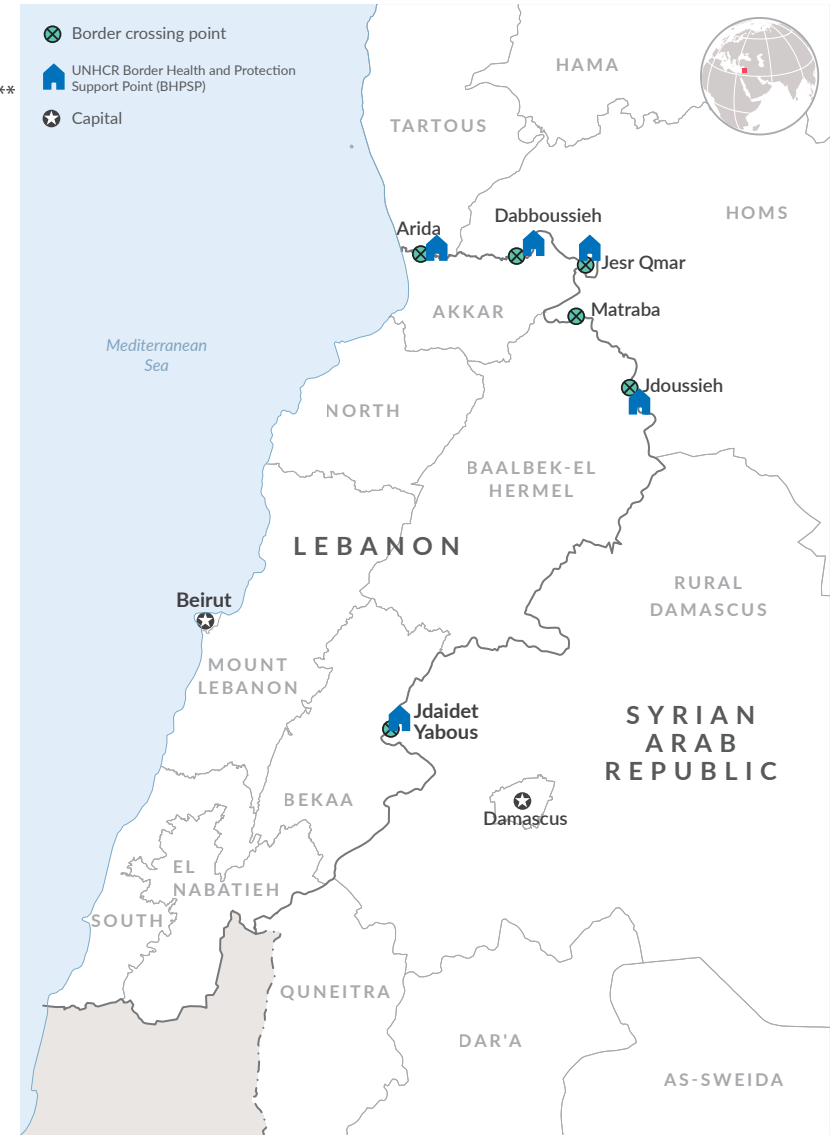
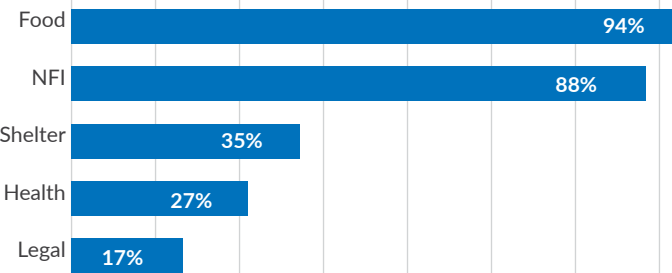


Age and gender breakdown
