

Summary

This dashboard summarizes the views of Sudanese refugees, on the situation and protection risks in Chad. The households interviewed either at the entry points or at the transit sites, a few days after their arrival in Chad, mentioned the trauma of fleeing and the relief of having crossed the border.

From September 1 to October 25, 2024, **582 households of 2,035 new arrivals were** interviewed, including 337 households of 1,282 individuals at Birak entry point and 245 households of 753 individuals at the Kulbus, in **Wadi Fira province**.

The main trends to be highlighted from the interviews are as follows:

Access to the asylum country

- 57% of households surveyed said that reasons related to insecurity was the main driver of their flight to Chad while 41% mentioned preventive displacement.
- 78% reported experience of Human Rights violations, including :
 - physical assault 36%
 - extortion of property 32%
 - illegal taxes 9%
 - UXOs and mine hazard 1%.
- 64% of the households have family members stuck in Sudan and unable to join Chad because of:
 - Risk of arbitrary arrest (53%)
 - Lack of means of transportation (28%)
 - fear of forced recruitment (3%) .

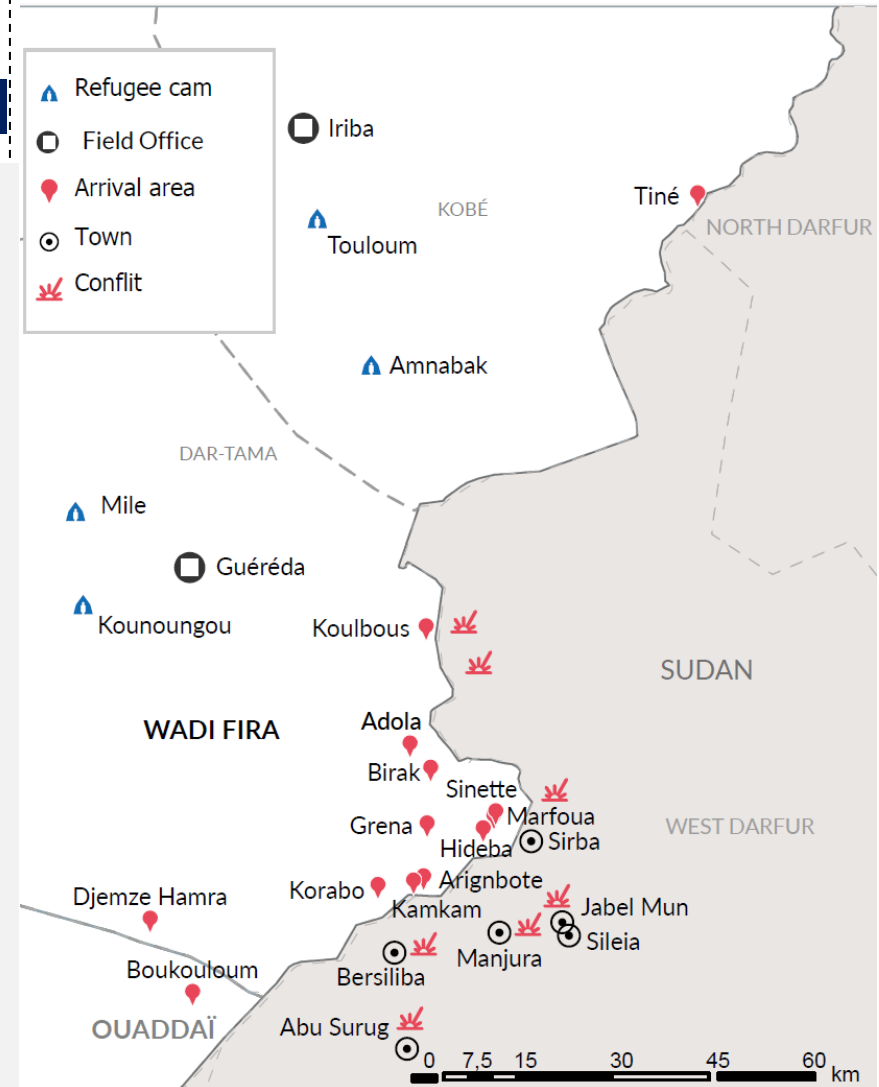
Education

- 54% of households indicated that their children dropped out of school due to the crisis.
- 96% of households have children of school age.

Documentation

- 23% have birth certificates and 26% have identity cards or other types of documents
- 52% of households don't have documents and claimed that their documents were lost or burnt (92%) or confiscated in the country of origin (8%).

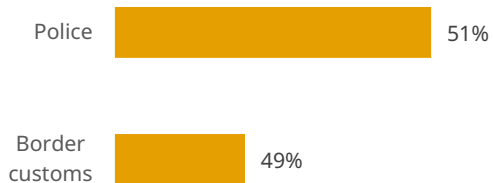
NEW ARRIVALS FLOWS



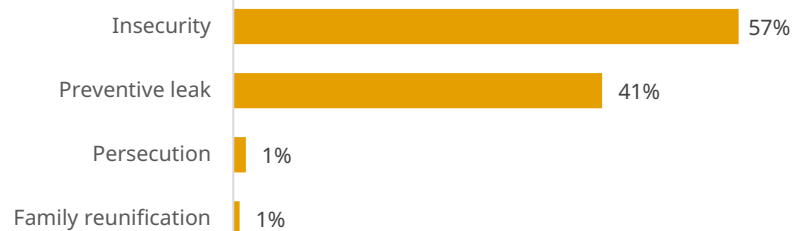


ACCESS TO THE ASYLUM COUNTRY

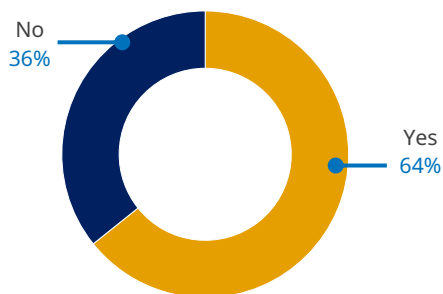

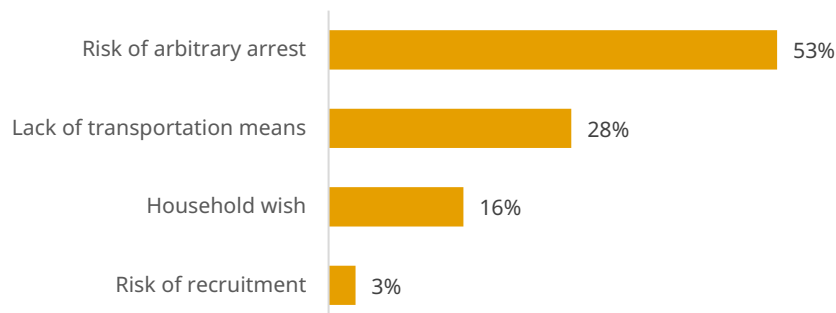
Reason(s) of displacement



Family members still in Sudan

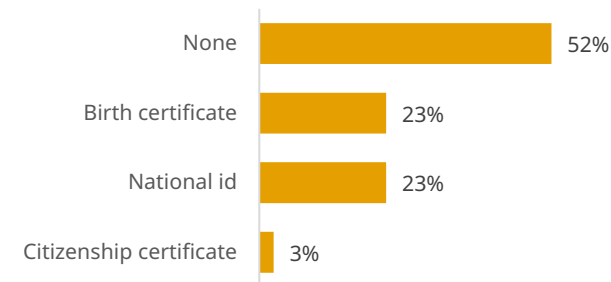


Family members still in Sudan : reasons

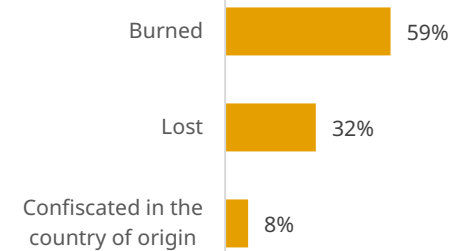

Individual documents possessed by refugees

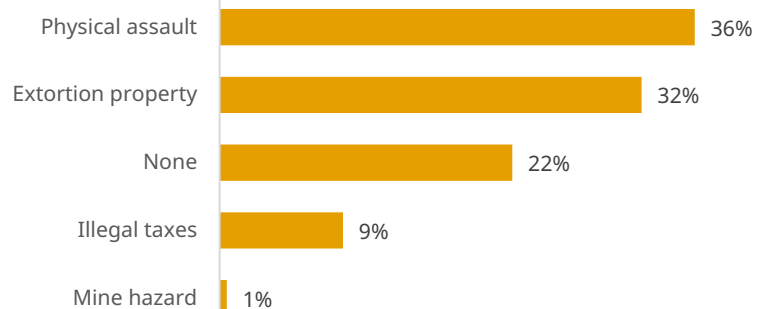


Reason for not having individual documents



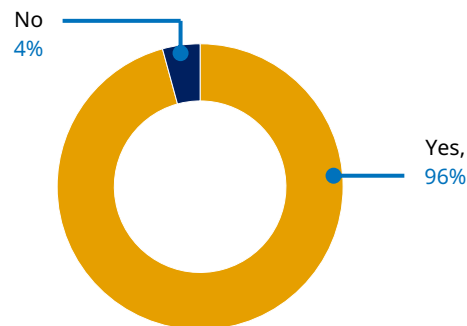
RISK OF PROTECTION DURING DISPLACEMENT
