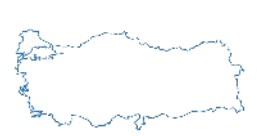

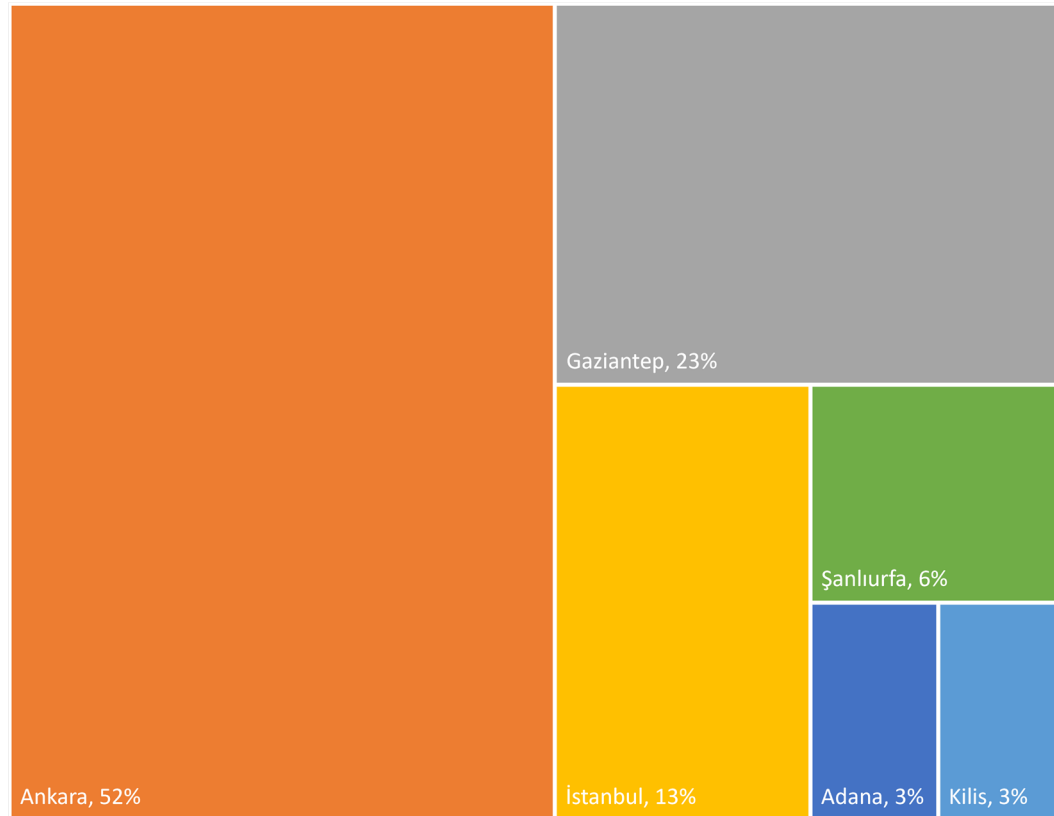

# CVA Mapping 2024 Overview

- CBI TWG conducts the Mapping of Cash and Voucher Assistances in Türkiye to provide a comprehensive overview of the cash-based responses implemented by humanitarian actors within the year.
- **This exercise aims to**
  - ❖ Analyze the scale, scope, and geographical distribution of CVA programmes, including MPCA and winterisation support,
  - ❖ Identify trends and gaps in assistance,
  - ❖ Provide a glossary of CVAs in Türkiye,
  - ❖ and inform evidence-based decision-making.





# CVA Mapping 2024 Overview - Survey

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Main data fields in the survey are as following:

## Information on Organization and Programme:

- This data field captures details on implementing organizations, programme scope, and timelines to map actors and activities.
  - ❖ Names of organization and programme, brief project description, start and end dates.

## Reporting Details:

- This data field tracks sector focus, reporting status, and listing in Services Advisor for coordination and data accuracy. This information can be helpful for referrals.
  - ❖ Under which sector the project is being implemented, monthly Activity Info reporting status, whether the project is listed under Services Advisor.

  - ❖ Weather if it is specific to Winterisation

## Information on Funding: Understanding funding landscape

- This data field captures funding details. Funding details are not compulsory to fill in. However, missing information prevents understanding the big picture.
  - ❖ Number and names of the donor agencies, % of funding for each donor





# CVA Mapping 2024 Overview - Survey

## Modality-Conditionality-Frequency...:

- The answers provide a comprehensive overview of how CVA is implemented, what modalities and approaches have been experimented..
- This data helps in sharing lessons learned, and feeds into strategic planning,
- A chance to check if CVA interventions are well-coordinated, inclusive, and responsive to the needs of the targeted populations across Türkiye.
  - ❖ e.g. If this is an EQ, MPCA or emergency assistance, geographical coverage (nation-wide or specific provinces), conditionality and restriction of CVA, duration, frequency of payment, transfer amount calculation details, transfer mechanism, targeted vulnerabilities, required documentation for application, self-referral possibility





# CVA Mapping 2024 Overview - Survey

## Targeted Population

- Economically vulnerable households (e.g., deteriorated financial status, reduced food consumption, selling assets to meet needs)
- Single parents or caregivers (with dependents)
- Elderly individuals (especially those living alone or with limited support)
- Children and youth (including those in child labor or at risk of exploitation)
- Persons with disabilities (including those with documented disability reports)
- Female-headed households
- LGBTI+ individuals (who may be at risk or marginalized)
- People who cannot access adequate shelter" (e.g., persons recently discharged from state care institutions, homeless individuals, people living in temporary settlements or those who have lost their homes)
- Refugees without registration (inc. pending registrations and ones with activation problems).
- Persons affected by or at risk of gender-based violence (GBV)
- Households with a high dependency ratio (e.g., 4+ children, high number of dependents per adult)
- Persons engaged in informal, seasonal, or at-risk employment (including those recently unemployed or without marketable skills)
- Health-vulnerable populations (e.g., persons with chronic illness, pregnant/nursing women)
- Persons facing educational barriers or school-related challenges (e.g., school dropouts or those unable to cover education-related costs)

## Assessed Vulnerabilities

- Economic vulnerabilities (e.g., deteriorated financial situation, no members engaged in employment)
- Dependency-related vulnerabilities (e.g., households with 4+ children, high dependency ratio)
- Protection-related vulnerabilities (e.g., gender-based violence survivors, persons at risk due to gender, age, or sexual orientation)
- Labor-related vulnerabilities (e.g., persons in informal employment or recently unemployed)
- Health-related vulnerabilities (e.g., pregnant/nursing women, persons with chronic illnesses)
- Education-related risks (e.g., risk of school drop-out, inability to cover education costs)
- None of the above (vulnerabilities are not assessed)

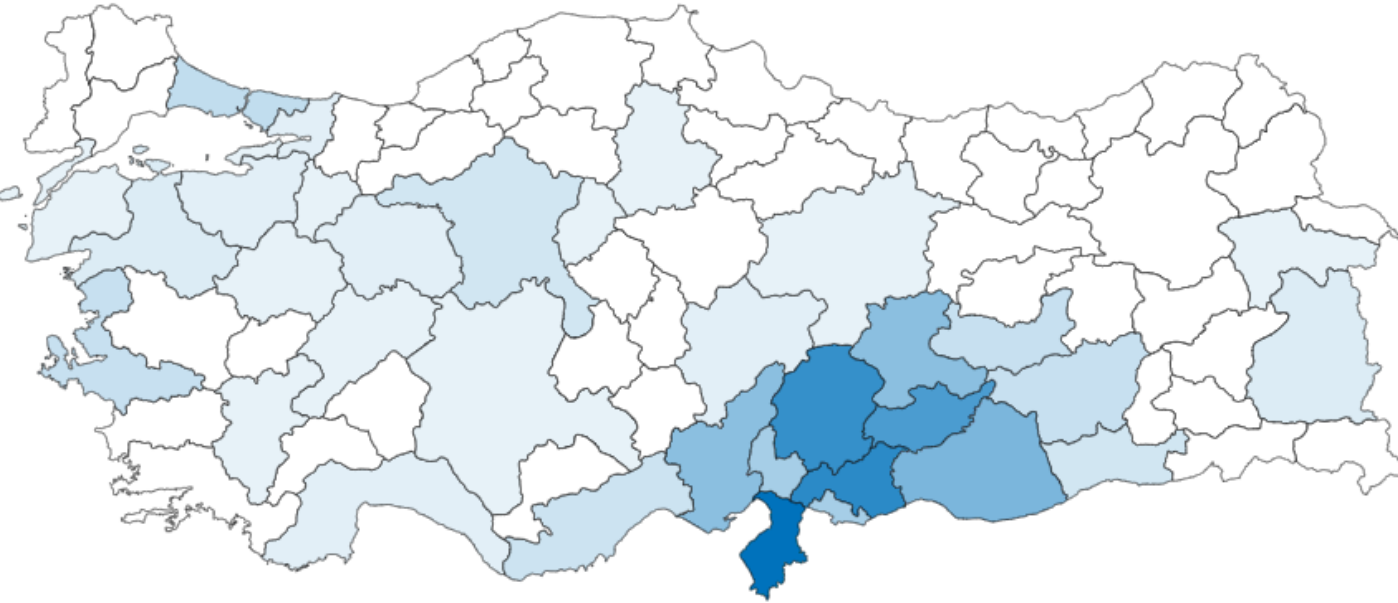

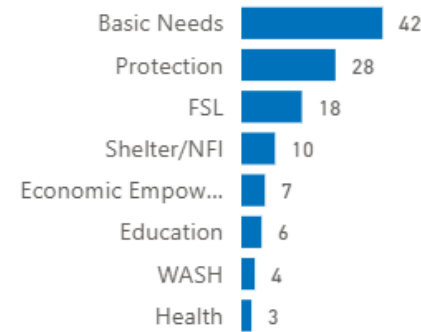


Provincial Breakdown for Cash-Based Interventions in Türkiye

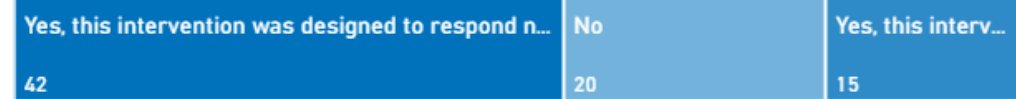

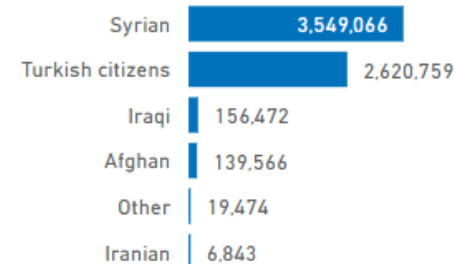

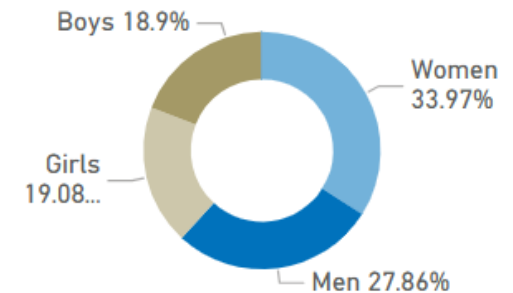
### Is this an Earthquake Response intervention?

# Neden Koruma Nakit Desteđi? Why Cash for Protection?

- Afet ve krizler sonrası kaybolan finansal kaynaklar ve geim kaynakları nedeniyle ortaya ıkan koruma riskleri ve olumsuz bař etme mekanizmaları
- İhtiyaların bađımsız ve onurlu bir řekilde karřılanmasını sađlayan ara
- Krizden etkilenmiř yerel ekonomiye katkı
- Yerinden edilmiř kiřiler ile ev sahibi topluluklar arasında bir arada yařama kltr
- 2016'daki Dnya İnsani Zirvesi'nin ardından insani yardım kuruluřlarının nakit desteklerinin kullanımını ve koordinasyonunu taahht
- People affected by crises may lose their livelihoods and financial resources, face various protection risks, and resort to negative coping mechanisms.
- By providing cash assistance instead of material support, people are enabled to prioritize and meet their needs independently and with dignity, thereby reducing their vulnerability to many protection risks.
- Cash assistance also has benefits for the local economy and can contribute to cohabitation between displaced persons and host communities.
- Following the 2016 World Humanitarian Summit, humanitarian organizations committed to the use and coordination of cash assistance in delivering aid to crisis-affected populations.

# Desteğin Teknik Kapsamı /Technical Content of the Support

- TCDS kapsamında yürütülen kapsamlı ve çok sektörlü çalışmaların bir parçasıdır.
- Yalnızca sosyal çalışmacılar tarafından talep edilir.
- TCDS'den hayatta kalanları ve risk altındaki kadın ve kız çocuklarını, LGBTI+ bireyleri acil durumlarda hayat kurtarıcı müdahalelerle destekler.
- TCDS risklerinin azaltılması: KND, kadınların ve kız çocuklarının, LGBTI+ bireylerin daha fazla TCDS riskine maruz bırakılmasını önler.
- TCDS'den hayatta kalanların hizmetlere erişerek iyileşmesini ve güçlenmesini destekler.
- Protection cash assistance is part of STL's comprehensive and multi-sectoral efforts to combat gender-based violence.
- It is requested only by social workers
- Emergency support: CfP provides life-saving interventions for survivors of GBV and supports women and girls at risk, as well as LGBTI+ individuals, in emergency situations.
- Reducing GBV risks: CfP prevents women, girls, and LGBTI+ individuals from being exposed to further GBV risks.
- Access to services: CfP supports survivors of GBV in accessing services to aid their recovery and empowerment

# Desteyin Teknik Kapsamı Technical Content of the Support

Koruma nakit desteęi ařaęıdaki durumları kapsamaz:

- Aıka tanımlanmış koruma endiřesi olmayan sosyo-ekonomik kırılganlıkları ve temel ihtiyalar.
- Koruma endiřesinin nakit desteęi ile hafifletilemeyeceęi ya da giderilemeyeceęi vakalar.
- Vaka yoneti mi kapsamında deęerlendirilmeyen bireyler.

- **Protection cash assistance does not cover the following situations:**
- CfP should not aim solely to address general socio-economic vulnerabilities and basic needs.
- A causal link must be established between a clearly defined protection concern and how this concern will be mitigated or resolved with the provided cash assistance.
- Individuals not assessed within the case management cannot benefit from CfP

## Destegin Süresi / Duration of the CfP

Koruma amaçlı nakit yardımı, acil bir koruma endişesini ele almayı amaçladığında tek seferlik bir transferdir.

Özel koşullarda tekrarlanan ödemeleri de içerebilir.

Bu yüzden, mevcut koruma endişeleri göz önüne alındığında tek seferlik bir ödemenin mi yoksa birden fazla transferin mi uygun olduğunu belirlemek için vaka bazında bir yaklaşım uygulanır.

Protection cash assistance can be a one-time transfer when it aims to address an urgent protection concern.

Repeated payments are only possible under special conditions.

Therefore, a case-by-case approach is applied to determine whether a one-time payment or multiple transfers are appropriate, considering existing protection concerns, and this approach is justified in the CfP approval form

## Destegin Tutarı / Amount of the CfP

- Standart bir tutar yoktur.
- Kiři baři ortalama yaklařık tutar 185 EUR karřılıđı Trk Lirası'dır.
- Danıřanın koruma ihtiyaına gre gereken mal ya da hizmetleri gz nnde bulundurarak hesaplanır.
- Ortalama tutarın ařıldıđı durumlarda KND onay sreci deđiřir.

There is no standard amount.

The average amount per person is the equivalent of approximately 185 EUR in Turkish Lira.

The amount is determined taking into account the goods or services required according to the protection needs of the client.

If the need exceeds this amount, the approval process changes.



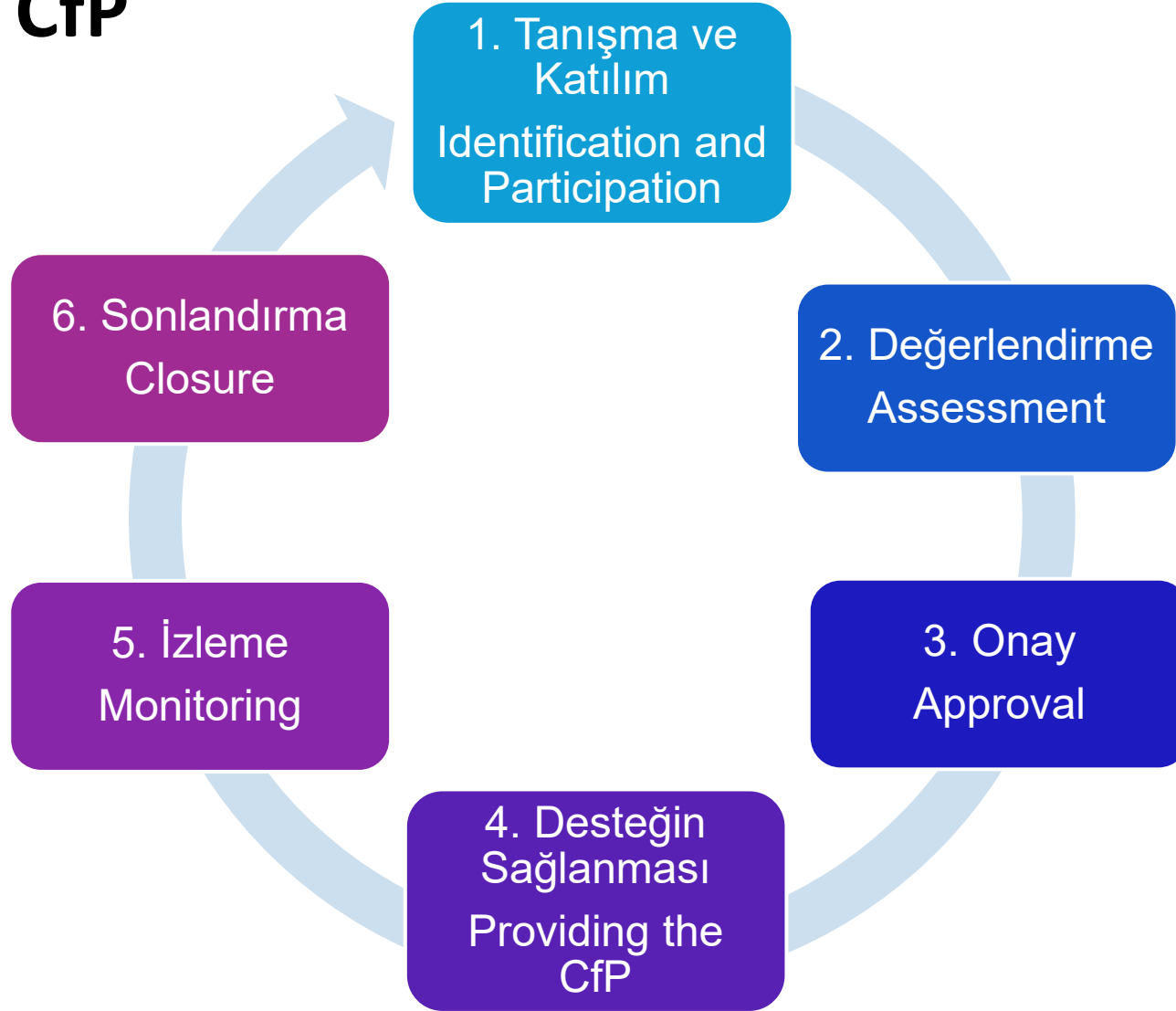
# Uygunluk Kriterleri / Eligibility Criteria

- 6 temel TCDSŞ türü / Hayatta kalan & risk altında bulunan bireyler (Proje hedef kitlesine bağlı olarak ilgili kırılgan gruplar önceliklendirilir.)
- Risk seviyesine göre önceliklendirme
- Gerekli yönlendirmeler ve müdahalelerden sonra son çare olarak uygulanır, hem acil hem de zamana bağlı olmayan koruma endişelerine yanıt verir.
- Destek sağlanacak kişiler vaka yönetim sürecine dâhil olmalıdır. Vaka yönetimi kapsamında iş birliğine açık ve rıza göstermiş olmalıdır.
- Türkiye’de resmi olarak kayıtlı kişilere verilir. İstisnai acil durumlarda kayıtlı olmayan kişilere de verilebilir.
- 6 main types of GBV / Survivors & individuals at risk: Priority is given to relevant vulnerable groups based on the project target population.
- Prioritization according to risk level.
- Applied as a last resort after necessary referrals and interventions, responding to both urgent and non-urgent protection concerns.
- Individuals eligible for support must be included in the case management process and must be cooperative and give consent within the scope of case management.
- Provided to individuals officially registered in Turkey. In exceptional emergency situations, it may also be provided to unregistered individuals.

## Koruma Çıktıları/ Protection Outcomes

- Şiddetin, zorlamanın, yoksunluğun, istismarın veya ihmalin etkisini durdurmak /hafifletmek/ azaltmak
- Şiddet, zorlama, yoksunluk, istismar veya ihmal olaylarından sonra saygınlığı geri kazanmak.
- Zararlı ve tehlikeli başa çıkma mekanizmalarına olan bağımlılığı azaltmak/önlemek.
- Belirli grupların karşılaştığı sosyal dışlanmayı/ yapısal ayrımcılığı azaltmak
- Acil hayat kurtarıcı ihtiyaçlara veya temel insan haklarına yönelik kritik risklere yanıt vermek
- Stopping/mitigating/reducing the impact of violence, coercion, deprivation, abuse, or neglect.
- Restoring dignity after incidents of violence, coercion, deprivation, abuse, or neglect.
- Reducing/preventing dependency on harmful and dangerous coping mechanisms.
- Reducing social exclusion/structural discrimination faced by specific groups.
- Responding to critical risks related to urgent life-saving needs or fundamental human rights.

# KND Süreci / CfP Process



## Örnek destekler/

**Tahliye ve Güvenli Konaklama:** Taşınma, kira, geçici barınma, güvenli barınma için ulaşım vb.

**Hukuki Yardım ve Belge Tedariği:** Kimlik belgeleri veya diğer önemli evraklara erişim hukuki danışmanlık, mahkeme ücretleri, belge masrafları vb.

**Sağlık ve Psikososyal Destek:** Tıbbi tedavi ve psikolojik desteğe erişim için tedavi masraflarını, ekipman, ulaşım giderleri vb.

**Ev ve Barınma Haklarının Korunması:** Evin yeniden inşası, onarım malzemeleri, uzun vadeli konaklama çözümlerine erişim, avukat ücretleri, mahkeme masraflarını vb.

**Evacuation and Safe Accommodation:** Individuals under threat can use cash assistance for safe relocation, covering transport, temporary lodging, and rent.

**Legal Aid and Document Access:** Support for legal consultancy and document fees for those needing identity or other essential documents.

**Health and Psychosocial Support:** Survivors of abuse can use cash assistance for medical treatment and psychological support.

**Protection of Housing and Shelter Rights:** Individuals with damaged homes can use assistance for rebuilding, repairs, and long-term accommodation; covers legal fees as well.

# Ödeme Yöntemleri / Payment Methods

## Hesaba Transfer

- Danışanın banka hesabına havale veya EFT ile aktarılır.
- Destek, istenilen zamanda ve miktarda çekilebilir, geri çekim yapılmaz.

## İsme Transfer

- Herhangi bir bankaya yararlanıcının adına yatırılır ve 30 gün içinde çekilmezse geri döner.
- Tek seferlik çekim yapılır, gerekli belgeler sağlanarak bankadan alınabilir.

## Elden Ödeme

- Banka erişimi olmayan veya kayıtsız yararlanıcılar için "elden ödeme" seçeneği kullanılır.
- Teslimat, bir STL personeli ve kamu görevlisi eşliğinde yapılır; Nakit Teslim Tutanağı imzalanır.

## Account Transfer

- Support is transferred to the beneficiary's bank account via wire or EFT.
- The beneficiary can withdraw the support at any time and amount; no refund is made.

## Named Transfer

- Support is transferred to a bank account registered in the beneficiary's name, and it returns if not withdrawn within 30 days.
- A single withdrawal is allowed; required documents can be provided to collect from the bank.

## Cash in Hand

- “Cash payment” is used for beneficiaries without bank access or registration.
- Delivery is conducted in the presence of an STL staff member and a public official; Cash Delivery Receipt is signed

# İzleme, Değerlendirme ve Sonlandırma / Monitoring, Evaluation and Closure

## Destek Sonrası İzleme

- Destek sağlandıktan 2 hafta sonra; İzleme ve Değerlendirme ekibi tarafından uygulanır.
  - Program erişilebilirliği
  - Risk yaratma/ Zarar verme durumu
  - Desteğin tutarı
  - Program çıktısı
  - Personel tutumu
  - Geri bildirim ve şikayet mekanizmasına erişim

Not: KND sürecinin sona ermesi vaka yönetim sürecinin sona erdiği anlamına gelmez. KND sadece müdahalelerden bir tanesidir.

## Post-Support Monitoring

Conducted 2 weeks after support is provided by the Monitoring and Evaluation team.

- Program accessibility
- Risk creation/harm potential
- Amount of support provided
- Program output
- Staff attitude
- Access to feedback and complaint mechanisms

*Note: The end of the CfP process does not mean the end of the case management process. CfP is only one of the interventions.*
