Priorities moving forward	<p>Summary of priorities identified (in Surveys from the mapping that was conducted amongst task force members) was shared visually in a slide. This included the following points:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <i>building a more <b>cohesive team</b> to work effectively with Ukrainians on <b>awareness raising</b></i></li> <li>• <i>Strengthening <b>capacity of relevant authorities and stakeholders</b></i></li> <li>• <i>Increased <b>identification</b> of potential VoTs and TCN VoTs.</i></li> <li>• <b>Information</b> sources for Ukrainians (well-built, official, rights, news about changes, timely and efficient and accessible.</li> <li>• <b>Ukrainian mediators</b> for education and health</li> </ul>	Development of a strategy/action plan in how the task force may move forward in a way that is informed by the priorities that have been identified. Draft of key topics/priorities to be put together prior to next meeting.

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Provision <i>and</i> promotion of <b>free translation and legal services</b> to increase update and accessibility amongst Ukrainian population</li> <li>• <b>112, police stations, hospital emergency rooms</b> require an available on-call <b>Ukrainian translator</b> to handle <b>emergencies</b> in a timely manner</li> <li>• Prioritise <b>engaging with local communities</b> including vulnerable populations and VoTs to understand their needs and empower them to <b>actively participate</b> in prevention and response efforts</li> <li>• <b>Ensuring all efforts are victim-centred</b> (needs, rights, voices are prioritised and respected at all stages (identification, exit from trafficking situation, recovery and reintegration</li> <li>• Programs and interventions that <b>address the root causes of trafficking</b> (poverty, inequality, discrimination, access to education/employment, conflict + promotion of social inclusion and economic empowerment.</li> <li>• Prioritise the collection of <b>disaggregated data</b> and conduct <b>research</b> to better <b>understand intersections of TiP with various forms of marginalisation and exclusion</b> - utilise evidence to inform targeted interventions and advocacy efforts.</li> <li>• Implementation of <b>community-based prevention programs</b> to raise awareness of risks and consequences of TiP, and promote: gender equality &amp; human rights and empower individuals against TiP through recognition and options to avoid risky situations</li> </ul> <p>Opportunity was opened up to discuss any additional points or priorities (and for members to share any additional thoughts they may have between now and next meeting via email).</p>	
Capacity Building Offers/Support Requests	<p>Summary of capacity building/support requests identified (in Surveys from the mapping that was conducted amongst task force members) was shared visually in a slide. This included the following points:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Good psychologist with Ukrainian / Russian language</li> <li>• Prevention of online sexual abuse and exploitation of children</li> <li>• NIRM - annexes, tools, how it works, starting from identification of presumed VoT onwards</li> </ul> <p>Overview of the vision/intention to utilise this space as an opportunity to share knowledge/supports.</p> <p>Participants were invited to share any additional needs/requests or ideas they</p>	

have of knowledge/capacity building they could share amongst other members.

Plan International raised: They have some programming in OCSEA in South East Asia. They are in discussions about contextualising it for Romania so as this develops. Invitation made for Plan to let TF know when they may be situated to progress this area.

NIRM guides and friendly versions are being developed so this will be something in future to provide a session on also.

Key ones summarised from survey included:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Online grooming (in particular relating to Ukrainian refugee children and youth);</li> <li>• Ongoing risks of those displaced, including around domestic abuse</li> <li>• Impacts of air Schengen was raised as a concern</li> <li>• Lack of information regarding renting procedures/rights</li> </ul>	<p>The abovementioned action plan/strategy would also be informed by these.</p>
<p>AOB &amp; updates</p>	<p>Survey indicated a spread of people who would like the meeting held monthly and some who would prefer every two months or less frequently.
