New Funding Opportunities

Title of the Call: Media Incubation Grants (RO/RU)

Deadline: December 30th, 2024

Funding Source: Foreign, Commonwealth & Development Office (FCDO) and United States Agency for International Development (USAID)

Eligibility of Entities to Apply:

- Open to independent media institutions, civil society organizations (CSOs), journalists, bloggers, vloggers, influencers, and other content creators from Moldova.
- Applicants must focus on media and communications-related projects.

Thematic Focus:

- Media Development: Projects supporting independent media, fostering media literacy, or producing high-quality, impactful content in Moldova.
- Content Creation: Initiatives aimed at creating innovative, engaging, and socially relevant content for diverse audiences.

Funding Details:

- Award Ceiling: USD 12,500

Title of the Call: CEB Award for Social Cohesion 2025

Deadline: January 3rd, 2025

Funding Source: Council of Europe Development Bank (CEB)

Eligibility of Entities to Apply:

- Open to individuals (aged 18 and older) and organizations from CEB member countries.
- Initiatives must focus on addressing social issues and contribute significantly to social cohesion.
- Projects benefiting CEB member countries are eligible.
- Projects that have received or are receiving CEB funding (loans or grants) are ineligible.
- Preference may be given to individuals, micro-enterprises, and organizations with no more than 50 employees.

Thematic Focus:

- **Social Cohesion:** Projects that contribute to strengthening social cohesion through innovative and effective solutions addressing pressing social issues.
- **Impact:** Initiatives that have a significant, measurable impact on the communities they serve.
- **Sustainability:** Projects with long-term viability and the potential for sustained outcomes.
- **Innovation and Replicability:** Recognizing solutions that offer new approaches to social challenges and have the potential to be replicated in other contexts.

Title of the Call: Humanitarian Action and Responsible Artificial Intelligence (AI)

Deadline: January 13th, 2025

Funding Source: Foreign, Commonwealth & Development Office (FCDO)

Eligibility of Entities to Apply:

- Open to NGOs and nonprofit organizations.
- Applicants must focus on humanitarian aid and research related to responsible AI applications.

Thematic Focus:

- **Humanitarian AI Applications:** Research on how AI systems can be responsibly integrated into humanitarian action while addressing associated risks.
- **Risk Mitigation:** Identifying strategies to minimize ethical, operational, and technical risks related to AI deployment in crisis response and humanitarian activities.
- **AI and Humanitarian Effectiveness:** Exploring innovative AI-driven solutions to enhance the efficiency and impact of humanitarian aid.

Title of the Call: Fund for Cultural Preservation (AFCP) 2025

Deadline: January 17th, 2025

Funding Source: U.S. Embassy to Moldova

Eligibility of Entities to Apply:

- Open to reputable and accountable non-commercial entities, including non-governmental organizations, museums, educational institutions, ministries of culture, or similar organizations.
- Eligible implementers must demonstrate capacity to manage cultural preservation projects.
- Ineligible entities include individuals, commercial entities, and organizations that have failed to meet the objectives of previous awards.

Thematic Focus:

- Preservation of Cultural Heritage: Focus on historic buildings, archaeological sites, manuscripts, museum collections, and traditional cultural expressions such as languages and crafts.
- Priority Activities: Anastylosis, conservation, consolidation, documentation, preventive conservation, restoration, and stabilization.

- Grant Range: \$25,000 to \$500,000 per project.
- Project Duration: Up to 60 months.

Title of the Call: Applications open for Motorola Solutions Foundation Grant Program

Eligibility of Entities to Apply:

- Open to nonprofit organizations that focus on first responder programming and technology & engineering education.
- Priority is given to organizations that support underserved and underrepresented populations, including women, people with disabilities, the LGBTQ community, veterans, and others.
- Organizations with strong financial health and data-driven evaluation methods, including measurable metrics, are encouraged to apply.

Title of the Call: REINFORCING Grant on "Responsible Digitalization"

Deadline: 30-Jan-2025

Funding Source: REINFORCING

Eligibility of Entities to Apply:

- Open to organizations and territories experimenting with Open Responsible Research and Innovation (ORRI) approaches.
- Must be aligned with the goal of experimenting with and implementing actions around "Responsible Digitalization."

Thematic Focus:

- **Responsible Digitalization:** Projects focusing on the alignment of digitalization efforts with societal needs and expectations, ensuring responsible development and use of digital technologies.

Title of the Call: Applications open for Mitigation Action Facility Projects 2025

Deadline: February 19th, 2025

Funding Source: Mitigation Action Facility (MAF)

Eligibility of Entities to Apply:

- Open to entities implementing mitigation projects focused on energy, transport, industry, or cross-sectoral projects linked to these priority sectors.
- Projects must align with Nationally Determined Contributions (NDCs) 3.0 and long-term strategies (LTS), and contribute to global climate action goals under the UNFCCC framework.
- Applicants must demonstrate the ability to implement scalable and sustainable market-based financial mechanisms.

Thematic Focus:

- Energy: Projects targeting decarbonisation and energy transition.
- Transport: Mitigation strategies for reducing emissions in the transport sector.
- Industry: Climate action in industrial sectors to reduce carbon footprints.

Eligibility of Entities to Apply:

- Open to individuals or civil society groups, including national or international NGOs, associations, and private companies.
- Current members of the Parliamentary Assembly and deceased individuals are not eligible for nomination.

Thematic Focus:

- Gender Equality: Achievements promoting women's public participation and access to decision-making.
- Women's Role Models: Championing outstanding women's achievements and empowering role models.
- Inclusive Policies: Actions aimed at achieving transformative, inclusive policies and practices benefiting women in both public and private spheres.

Title of the Call: UNESCO-Equatorial Guinea International Prize for Research in the Life Sciences 2025

Deadline: 31-Mar-2025

Funding Source: UNESCO & the Republic of Equatorial Guinea

Eligibility of Entities to Apply:

- Open to individual scientists, groups of scientists, institutions, and non-governmental organizations that have made significant contributions to improving the quality of human life.
- Nominees must come from the fields of medicine, biology, agriculture, environmental sciences, and new technologies.
- Nominations can only be submitted by: UNESCO Member States through their National Commissions;
- Non-governmental organizations in official partnership with UNESCO active in relevant fields.

Thematic Focus:

- Life Sciences Research: Projects or activities that have made transformative discoveries with a significant impact on human health and the environment.
- Contribution to Human Life: Fostering innovation that improves the quality of life for individuals and communities worldwide.

Funding Details:

- Total Prize Value: US\$ 300,000
- Prize Distribution: Divided equally among up to three laureates.

Title of the Call: Civil Society Actors in the Eastern Neighborhood Countries

Eligibility of Entities to Apply:

- Open to civil society actors from the Eastern Neighborhood Countries (ENC).
- Civil society actors are broadly defined as civil society organizations, social movements, media, academia, trade unions, and community-based groups, including cultural, educational, and knowledge institutions.

- Youth: Projects focusing on empowering and engaging youth in civic activities.

Title of the Call: Special Issue with €1,000 Best Entry Prize

Funding Source: Sustained in collaboration with the Alexander von Humboldt Foundation's Humboldt Residency Programme

Eligibility of Entities to Apply:

- Open to researchers, civil society organizations, local collectives, and NGOs worldwide, with a particular focus on LMICs in the Global South.
- Submissions must include at least one co-author from the local community involved in research or case study to ensure proper representation.
- Submissions must represent original, completed work or research projects.

Title of the Call: Request for EOIs: Teachers Cannot Wait Program

Deadline: 24-Jan-2025

Funding Source: Education Cannot Wait (ECW)

Eligibility of Entities to Apply:

- Open to both international and national organizations legally constituted or represented in the country where services will be delivered.
- Applicants must be HACT assessed as "low" or "medium" risk in all localities of implementation, not only at HQ level.
- Applicants must be able to register on the United Nations partner portal and pass core assessments, including PSEA assessments.

- Teacher Support in EIEPC: Strengthening teacher capacities in formal and non-formal settings, with a focus on education in emergencies and protracted crises (EIEPC).

Eligibility of Entities to Apply:

- Open to organizations, not individuals or independent medical practice groups.
- Applicants must have a Principal Investigator (PI) with a medical, postdoctoral (MD, PhD, or equivalent), advanced nursing (BSN with MS/PhD), or terminal degree in Pharmacy, Social Work, or other relevant disciplines.
- The PI must be affiliated with an academic institution, hospital, or professional society.
- Proposals from global organizations are encouraged.

Eligibility of Entities to Apply:

- Open to individuals and teams globally working on advancing ideas in education.
- Teams may consist of up to three members.
- Nominations can be submitted for both the Education Research and Education Development categories, even if the nominee's work spans both areas.

Thematic Focus:

- Education Research: Awarding contributions that advance the theory of learning through disciplines like science, psychology, and statistics, helping educators refine their methods.
- Education Development: Recognizing efforts in the practice of learning, including new methods and widespread educational initiatives that champion effective approaches.

Title of the Call: Horizon Europe's Design for Adaptability, Re-use and Deconstruction of Buildings Programme

Deadline: Feb 4th, 2025

Funding Source: European Commission (EC)

Eligibility of Entities to Apply:

- Legal entities established in EU Member States, Overseas Countries and Territories (OCTs), countries associated with Horizon Europe, and eligible low- and middle-income countries. International European research organizations are also eligible.

Thematic Focus:

- Integrate innovative tools, products, and techniques for construction and renovation that extend the service life of buildings.
- Validate solutions that facilitate deconstruction, reuse, and adaptability of buildings.
- Develop materials and products that can be disassembled and reused, including CO2-storing bio-based materials.
- Address components of buildings including structural elements, envelopes, and technical systems.
- Ensure solutions are rooted in local/regional value chains and adaptable to local sourcing of materials.
- Address climate change mitigation and minimize negative impacts on pollution and biodiversity.

- Public bodies or international organizations are exempt from this check for grants under EUR 60,000.

Title of the Call: Hilton Humanitarian Prize

Deadline: Apr 30th, 2025

Funding Source: Conrad N. Hilton Foundation

Eligibility of Entities to Apply:

- Nominees must be established, nongovernmental, publicly supported charitable organizations.
- Nominees must have U.S. IRS tax-exempt status or equivalent for international organizations.
- Legally established for at least five years.
- Own audited financial statements for at least five consecutive years
- Expenditures greater than \$750,000 in the most recent audited fiscal year
- Cannot be a Hilton Humanitarian Prize Laureate or a local office/member organization of a Prize Laureate
- Cannot be local offices/member organizations of parent organizations or fiscally sponsored organizations.
- Cannot be specific programs within organizations or university-based projects.
- Cannot be academic institutions providing educational degrees but can be affiliates with independent tax-exempt status and audited financials.

Thematic Focus:

- Health and Wellness: Efforts to improve physical and mental health in underserved communities.
- Education: Initiatives aimed at increasing access to quality education for all
- Economic Empowerment: Programs that support economic self-sufficiency and poverty alleviation.
- Environmental Sustainability: Projects that promote environmental stewardship and sustainable practices.
