

In February 2025, approx 24,000 new internal displacements were monitored by the UNHCR-led Protection and Solutions Monitoring Network (PSMN). Major drivers include conflict and insecurity (18,246 - 77%), drought (2,997 - 13%), and other reasons (2,559 - 11%).

Overall, in Feruary 2025, PSMN recorded the highest number of internal displacement in **Qandala** (4000) followed by **Banadir** (3200) and **Luuq** (3100) districts. This figures include both arrival and departure dispacements.


Data presented in this report relates to returnees arriving in Somalia as of February 2025.

Since December 2014, UNHCR has supported **96,618** Somali refugees to return to Somalia. Additionally, a total of **44,292** Somalis were monitored as arriving spontaneously.



Assisted spontaneous returnees from Yemen by month









Returnees, refugee and asylum seekers map




Number of returnees (with assistance from UNHCR) by Year
