
From 2024, targeted violence and persecution in Myanmar's Rakhine State forces thousands of Rohingya to seek safety in Bangladesh. Unlike refugee registration, biometrically identified individuals are not issued with individual refugee identity documents, rather family cards to facilitating lifesaving assistance.

As of March 2025, UNHCR Bangladesh has registered/identified 1,102,556 Rohingya refugees (229,059 households) who fled persecution in Myanmar. Significant waves of arrivals occurred in 1990 and 2017, and new refugees continue to seek safety in Bangladesh in 2024 and 2025 due to escalating conflict in Rakhine State. As a result, a wave of new arrivals to the camps was identified in late 2024, and their biometric identification is ongoing.

77% of the refugees are women and children, while 8% are individuals with specific needs including persons with disabilities, single parents, those with serious medical conditions, unaccompanied minors, older persons at risk, and others requiring legal and physical protection. 51% of the population is female and 49% male. The largest age group (45%) comprises adults aged 18-59. The average household has five members: 36% of families consist of 4-5 people, while 12% live in households of eight or more.

The 33 camps in Cox's Bazar are densely populated: covering 23.6 square kilometers, the population density is of 45,000 one of the highest in the world.











Geographic overview (Population by camp)







