

REGIONAL REFUGEE RESPONSE PLAN FOR THE DEMOCRATIC REPUBLIC OF CONGO- 2024 2025

May 2025

The Regional Refugee Response Plan (RRP) for the DRC situation outlines a coordinated response strategy to respond to the needs of some **1.2 million DRC Refugees** who have sought international protection in neighboring countries, alongside **950,000 host community members**. The plan spans the assistance spectrum, setting out how partners will support government-led efforts to respond to the most vulnerable - including approximately **140,000 people who have fled the conflict in eastern DRC** to neighboring countries over the first four months of 2025- through the provision of life-saving humanitarian assistance, while also prioritizing the search for solutions both for new arrivals and protracted refugee populations. The RRP is fully aligned with the objectives of the Global Compact on Refugees, supporting the efforts of host governments to strengthen the protective environment for refugees by expanding refugee inclusion, self-reliance and resilience.

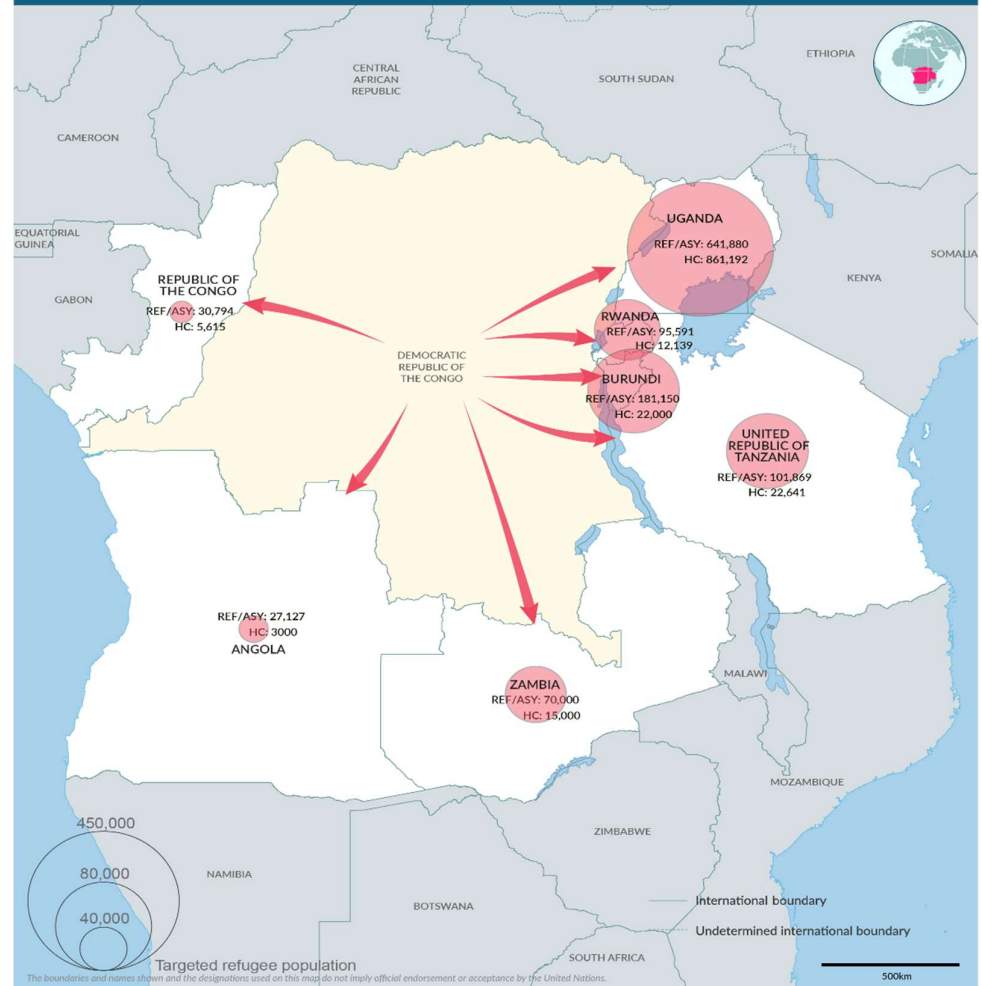
