

Context

Since mid-February 2025, conflict in Nasir County, Upper Nile State, between the SSPDF and the White Army has led to large-scale displacement. Thousands of civilians, primarily women and children, have recently crossed into Ethiopia via the Burbiey entry point in Wanthoa District, Nuer Zone, Gambella Region following the conflict in South Sudan that started on 16 February. As the SSPDF now controls Upper Nile state and gradually moving towards Jonglei state, the conflict is expected to intensify and cause further displacement into Ethiopia. Tensions remain high in Baliet, Ulang, Longochuk, Manyo, and Panyikang counties due to ongoing clashes between government forces and armed groups.
