

Asylum Trends

3rd largest asylum-seeking nationality worldwide in 2025 (MYR), after Sudanese and Venezuelans.

140% increase in the number of applications registered compared to 2024, making Cuba the leading country of origin for new asylum claims in Latin America.

50,622 new claims in LAC in the first half of 2025, mainly concentrated in Mexico, Brazil and Uruguay

In response to the growing number of asylum seekers from Cuba, countries across the region have introduced differentiated processing approaches and alternative legal stay arrangements: Costa Rica adopted simplified asylum procedures, while Uruguay and Costa Rica established regularization programs to grant Cuban nationals legal status, improve access to rights and services, and ease the pressure on asylum systems. Country-of-origin information has also proven essential for improving the quality and efficiency of case processing.

Demographics

- 175** Cuban nationals interviewed
- 39** is the average age, mostly adult men
- 64%** travelling alone
- 90%** travelling without children
- ≈50%** left Cuba within one month prior to the interview
- >1/3** have been displaced for more than one year



Reasons to leave

- 57%** Lack of employment / low income
- 33%** Victim of violence, threats or intimidation
- 32%** Lack of access to food
- 21%** Fear due to the general situation of violence/insecurity



Intentions

- 42%** plan to settle long term in the country of interview.
- 34%** expect to stay less than one year.
- 26%** remain undecided.
- 3%** intend to return to Cuba.
- i** Intentions have shifted from the United States toward Mexico as the primary destination.
