Afghan return figures are preliminary and expected to fluctuate upon validation on a weekly basis.

Syrians crossing the border include those who had planned to return before the conflict and others compelled to cross due to current conditions (25,750 reported intending to return permanently).

Such movements may reflect precautionary or temporary travel while individuals assess developments in the situation in Iran. Data as of 8 March covers only 2 of the 3 open border points.
