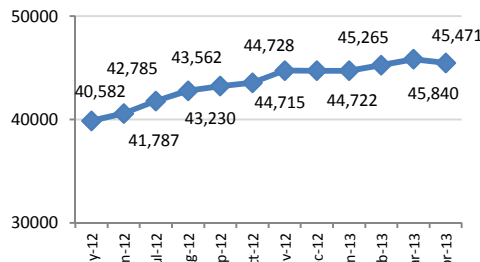

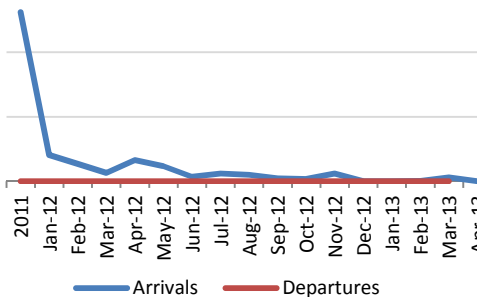

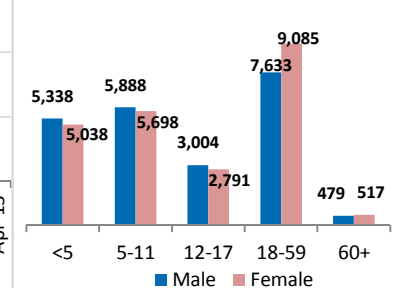

Highlights

UNHCR began on 06 May 2013, the relocation of 18,200 Sudanese refugees from flood prone Jamam refugee camp, to the new site, Kaya, ahead of the onset of this year's seasonal rains. Clashes between host and refugee communities in Doro camp illustrate the possible threat of civil unrest across Maban. Efforts are underway to bring the two communities together. Over 95% of refugee children have been immunized during the national polio immunization campaign this month. To date over 9,500 refugee children have been registered in camp schools in Doro, Gendrassa and Jamam.

Doro Monthly Updates

Protection

In April, biometric verification allowed virtually all old arrivals to be registered. While the camp population is similar to before the verification, the combination of new registrations and deactivations of persons who had left, died or previously registered twice. The verification brought forward information of several hundreds of persons registered in Tongo (Ethiopia), armed elements and South Sudanese. While the list of persons also registered in Tongo is currently being compiled and will be shared with colleagues on the other side of the border, UNHCR deactivated registrations of armed elements and South Sudanese. On 25 and 26 April, violence erupted between host community and Uduk refugees over what initially started over allegations that refugees had killed pigs belonging to the host community. SPLA and SSNPS entered the camps and fired shots to disperse the crowds. At least 10 persons sustained injuries. Four refugees were arrested. UNHCR will conduct interviews.

28 hand washing stations have been completed by WASH partners in Doro Schools. 4155 text distributed. Teachers have completed 1st phase of the English Language Training.

3 productive boreholes have been done by private contractors. In Yabus, Tango and Belotuma villages, It has been observed an increase of cases with acute water diarrhoea , especially for children under five. IOM is focused on these areas to improve water access. A total of 2480 m of pipeline was trenched and pipes were laid to supply water to Unity, Nur and Jamhuri schools.

** Family latrines are shared among 4 families, based on a average household size of 5 members, to respect the standard of 20 persons per drop-hole

UNHCR and Partners provided primary health services to refugees and access improved to health posts.

The most common cause of OPD consultations are LRTI , URTI, AWD and malaria.

HepE outbreak is on-going since august 2012 and as of April 28, 2013, a total of 257 HepE cases and 14 deaths recorded sinc start of outbreak .Attack rate for symptomatic jaundice was 0.6% for epidemiological week 17. No other outbreak reported

All children under five years were systematically screened for malnutrition, health and hygiene education sessions were held at the nutrition centres.
