Cholera in South Sudan

Situation Report # 53 as at 23:59 Hours, 8 July 2014

Situation Update

A total of 3,231 cholera cases including 70 deaths (CFR 2.2%) had been reported in South Sudan as of 8 July 2014 as summarized in Tables 1 and 2.

Figure 1. Central Equatoria State (Juba/Kajo-Keji/Yei counties) Epicurve 23 April to 8 July 2014

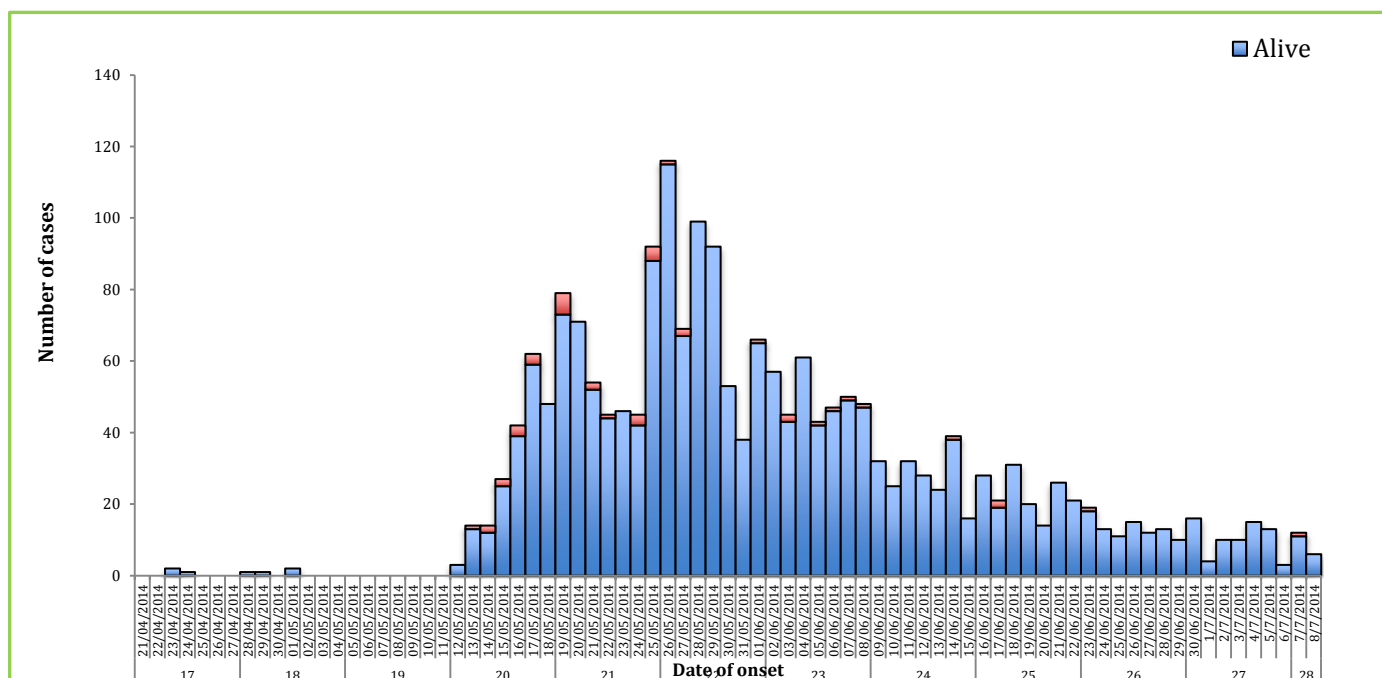


Figure 2. Eastern Equatoria State (Torit/Magwi/Lopa-Lafon counties) Epicurve 23 April to 7 July 2014

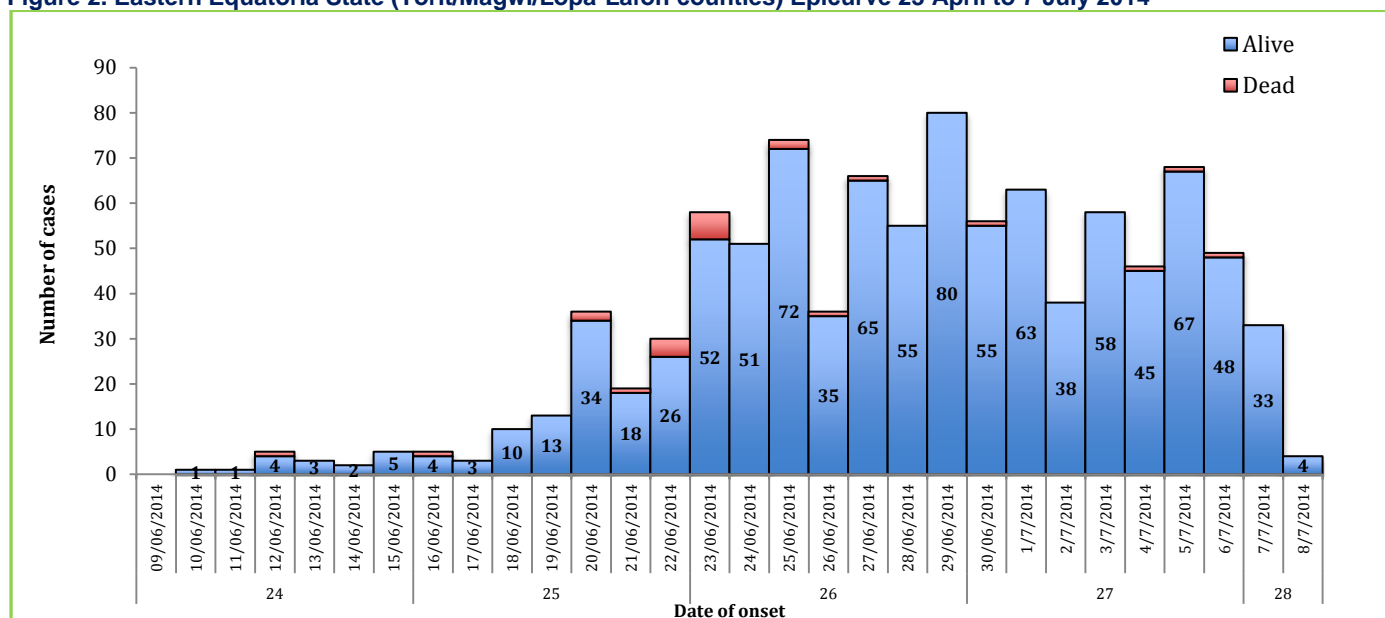


Table 3. Areas that continue to report suspected cholera alerts as at 8 July 2014

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Twenty six suspected cholera cases and one death have been reported in Malakal POC as of 8 July 2014. These are being managed in the POC area by MSF. Epidemiology and laboratory investigations are underway.
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> As of 09 July 2014, a total of 652 patients including 17 deaths (14 institution and three community) have been reported in Wau Shiluk CTC. Currently 207 patients are on treatment.
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> No new cases of suspected cholera cases have been reported from Bentiu. To date 15 suspected cholera cases have been reported in Bentiu. Eleven have tested positive following cholera rapid diagnostic testing. All the seven samples sent to the National Public Health Reference Laboratory in Juba have tested negative for cholera on culture. Preparedness and cholera response activities are ongoing in the Po area.
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> In Lul four patients are currently admitted in CTU as of 8 July 2014.
