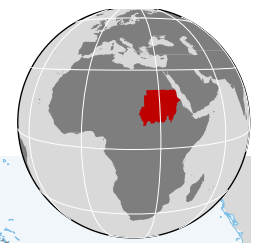


SUDAN: Arrivals from South Sudan






Over **93,415** persons have arrived in Sudan from South Sudan
