

# **November 2014 Explanatory Notes**

This Indicator Report provides a monthly snapshot of the regional response to the South Sudan Situation. The indicators included report on the Post 15 December 2013 South Sudan caseload only. The report is prepared through collaboration with the reporting country and the Regional Support Hub, Nairobi.

The notes below provide further contextual information on various sector indicators. Please note that Kampala is an urban area where refugees are not directly supported by UNHCR and its partners, so many of the indicators are not applicable to Kampala.



## SGBV

SGBV reporting among the South Sudanese population remains low with activities to increase sensitization and reporting ongoing across all hosting areas.



## CHILD PROTECTION

The number of Child Protection (CP) groups has increased in Adjumani from 15 in October to 23 in November. The additional 8 recorded in November were previously formed but had not yet received training by end of Otober. As of 30 November, they have all now received trianing.

The number of BIAs conducted in Adjumani has reduced from October as that was a cumulative figure not the total for just the month of October. In Adjumani in November 15 BIAs were conducted (making a cumulative total of 600 since December 2013)



# WASH

Figures are based on UNHCR's Water Monitoring System. As Uganda moves out of the initial emergency phase water yield is being monitored at every individual handpump rather than taking an average to increase accuracy which is why some figures remain below the standard.

Water availability is calculated based on population figures of registered refugees in the settlements. In Kiryandongo the actual population on ground is less than that recorded in the database as many of those recorded are not present in the settlement. The settlement is awaiting a population verification exercise where it is expected the population figure will decrease. Door to door household surveys show that the real availability is actually closer to 18 litres per person per day.



## NUTRITION

A comprehensive nutrition survey will be conducted in December, with results available in January. In November, the following number of children were screened upon arrival:

- Adjumani 142
- Arua 99
- Kiryandongo 81

### EDUCATION

The school age population in Uganda is as follows:

- Pre-primary: 3 5 years
- Primary: 6 12 years
- Secondary: 13 17 years

In Uganda primary education in public institutions is free of charge while fees are paid for secondary education.



## SHELTER / SITE

Uganda does not report on average dwelling floor size per person as the refugees build their own dwelling of various sizes on their own plot. Uganda reports on plot area per person rather than camp area as the refugees live in settlements and not camps.

### ACCESS TO ENERGY

The Uganda operation is not currently funded to distribute domestic fuel to households.
