


Weekly New Registration Population Composition 9th- 16th Aug 2015

* As of 16th August 2015, the overall registered population in Kakuma Refugee Camp stood at **181,756** (a slight reduction from the end of June 2015 figure(184,850) which is attributed to the inactivation of HR1 individuals who did not show up for the SIM equipping exercise during the 1st Cycle of July '15 food distribution. The individuals may be re-activated once they present themselves at the registration desk upon return to Kakuma R. Camp).


NOTES:

A total of **7,363** new arrivals have been registered since the start of 2015; with 469 arriving from Burundi, 530 from Democratic Republic of Congo (DRC), 131 from Ethiopia, 16 from Rwanda, 219 from Somalia, 5,067 from South Sudan, 853 from Sudan, and 78 from Uganda.

The total new born babies so far registered in 2015 is **2,682** including 87 registered during the reporting period.

198 individuals were registered during the thirty third week of 2015 [**9th - 15th Aug 2015**]; 28 from Burundi, 11 from Democratic Republic of Congo (DRC), 5 from Ethiopia, 4 from Somalia, 125 from South Sudan and 25 from Sudan.

The average family size registered during the reporting period stood at **3.2** individuals. Family size 1 households represented **38.30%** of all newly registered households.









Country of Origin

In addition to new arrivals reported here, the overall population in Kakuma also increases through new births, in-situ registration (of persons who arrived in a previous period but reported for registration later), family reunification, and various other data adjustments. Analysis and projections are based on actual persons registered in the UNHCR registration database (proGres)
