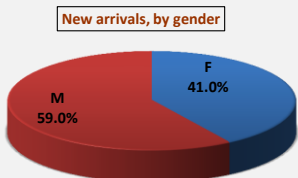




**Weekly New Registration Population Composition**

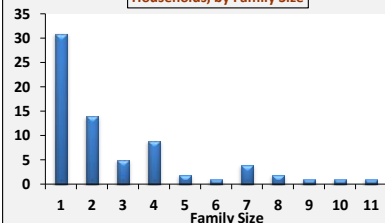
A total of **8,126** new arrivals have been registered since the start of 2015; with 615 arriving from Burundi, 623 from Democratic Republic of Congo (DRC), 140 from Ethiopia, 19 from Rwanda, 248 from Somalia, 5,488 from South Sudan, 892 from Sudan, 99 from Uganda and 2 from Yemen.

The total new born babies so far registered in 2015 is **2,912** including 55 registered during the reporting period.

**239** individuals were registered during the thirty seventh week of 2015 [ **06th Sep - 12th Sep 2015**]; 17 from Burundi, 42 from Democratic Republic of Congo (DRC), 4 from Ethiopia, 2 from Somalia, 155 from South Sudan, 14 from Sudan and 5 from Uganda.

The average family size registered during the reporting period stood at **2.8** individuals. Family size 1 households represented **49.47%** of all newly registered households.

**Households, by Family Size**



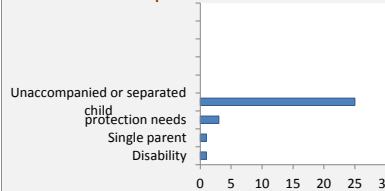

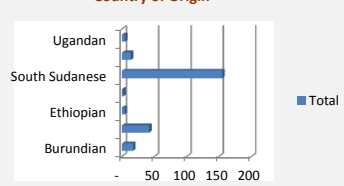

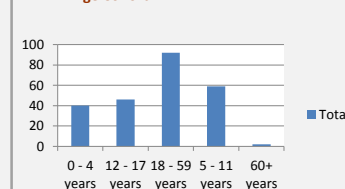

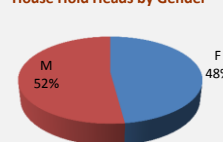

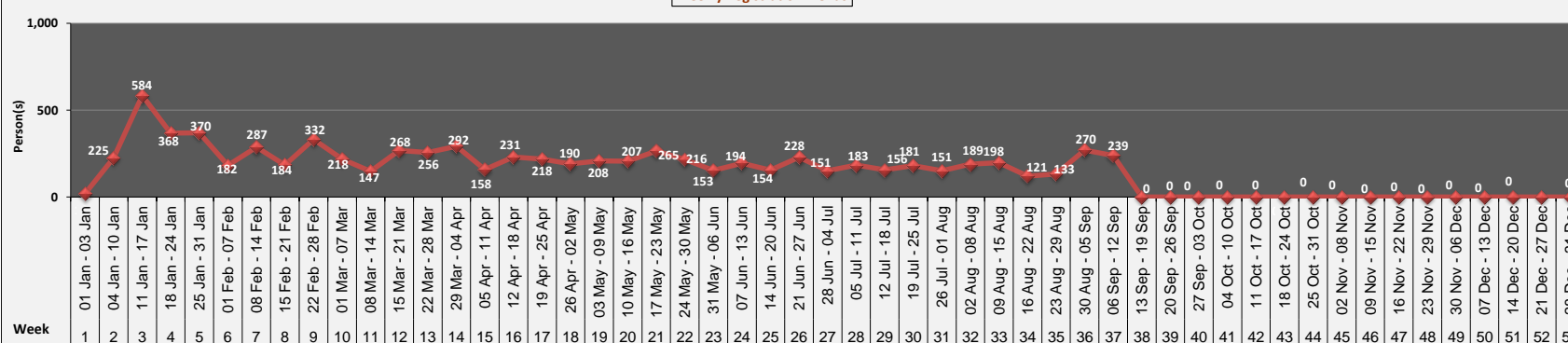
**Age Cohort**

Analysis and projections are based on actual persons registered in the UNHCR registration database (proGres)
