




New arrivals, by sex and COO




New arrivals, by sex and COO




New Arrivals Breakdown, By Age Cohort


Notes: A total of **3,438** new arrivals have been registered since the start of 2012; with 309 arriving from Burundi, 190 from Democratic Republic of Congo (DRC), 4 from Eritrea, 129 from Ethiopia, 1 from Iran, 1 from Ivory Coast, 8 from Rwanda, 194 from Somalia, 1,825 from South Sudan, 763 from Sudan and 14 from Uganda.

597 individuals were registered during the ninth week of 2012 [**27th Feb - 2nd March 2012**]; 28 from Burundi, 14 from Democratic Republic of Congo (DRC), 19 from Ethiopia, 24 from Somalia, 441 from South Sudan, 69 from Sudan and 2 from Uganda. As at 2nd March 2012, the overall population in Kakuma Refugee Camp stood at **89,626**.

The average family size registered during the reporting period stood at **3.4** individuals. Family size 1 households represented **40.8%** of all newly registered households.

As at 26th February 2012, the total South Sudanese 'returnee' figure stands at **62** individuals; mainly from Jonglei, Equatoria and Bahr el Ghazal States.

NB: This report reflects registration trends. In addition to new arrivals reported here, the overall population in Kakuma also increases through new births, in-situ registration (of persons who arrived in a previous period but reported for registration later), family reunification, and various other data adjustments. Analysis and projections are based on actual persons registered in the UNHCR registration database (proGres)
