




New arrivals, by sex and COO




Reasons for Flight




New Arrivals Breakdown, By Age Cohort




Households, by Family Size

Registration Breakdown in Weeks

NB: This report reflects registration trends. In addition to new arrivals reported here, the overall population in Kakuma also increases through new births, in-situ registration (of persons who arrived in a previous period but reported for registration later), family reunification, and various other data adjustments. Analysis and projections are based on actual persons registered in the UNHCR registration database (proGres)

Notes: A total of **11,033** new arrivals have been registered since the start of 2012; with 772 arriving from Burundi, 543 from Democratic Republic of Congo (DRC), 5 from Eritrea, 573 from Ethiopia, 1 from Iran, 1 from Ivory Coast, 51 from Rwanda, 577 from Somalia, 6,976 from South Sudan, 1,432 from Sudan, 1 from Tanzania and 101 from Uganda.

252 individuals were registered during the Twenty-Sixth week of 2012 [**25th-29th June 2012**]; 5 from Burundi, 23 from Democratic Republic of Congo (DRC), 26 from Ethiopia, 3 from Rwanda, 27 from Somalia, 146 from South Sudan, 19 from Sudan and 3 from Uganda. As at 30th June 2012, the overall population in Kakuma Refugee Camp stood at **98,380**.

The average family size registered during the reporting period stood at **2.5** individuals. Family size 1 households represented **58.6%** of all newly registered households.

As at 30th June 2012, the total South Sudanese 'returnee' figure stands at **260** individuals; mainly from Jonglei, Equatoria and Bahr el Ghazal States.

Additionally, the total new births recorded since January 2012 is **1,330**.
