

**Notes:** A total of **1,633** new arrivals have been registered since the start of 2013; with 83 arriving from Burundi, 70 from Democratic Republic of Congo (DRC), 73 from Ethiopia, 2 from Rwanda, 109 from Somalia, 855 from South Sudan, 425 from Sudan, and 16 from Uganda.

**581** individuals were registered during the Third week of 2013 [14th-20th January 2013]; 65 from Burundi, 32 from Democratic Republic of Congo (DRC), 17 from Ethiopia, 49 from Somalia, 277 from South Sudan, 131 from Sudan, and 10 from Uganda. As at 20th January 2013, the overall population in Kakuma Refugee Camp stood at **109,034**.

The average family size registered during the reporting period stood at **2.8** individuals. Family size 1 households represented **43%** of all newly registered households.

As at 20th January 2013, the total South Sudanese 'returnee' figure stands at **19** individuals; mainly from Jonglei, Equatoria and Bahr el Ghazal States.

Additionally, the total new births recorded since January 2013 is **203**.



Registration Breakdown in Weeks

NB: This report reflects registration trends. In addition to new arrivals reported here, the overall population in Kakuma also increases through new births, in-situ registration (of persons who arrived in a previous period but reported for registration later), family reunification, and various other data adjustments. Analysis and projections are based on actual persons registered in the UNHCR registration database (proGres)
