2013 Monthly total population



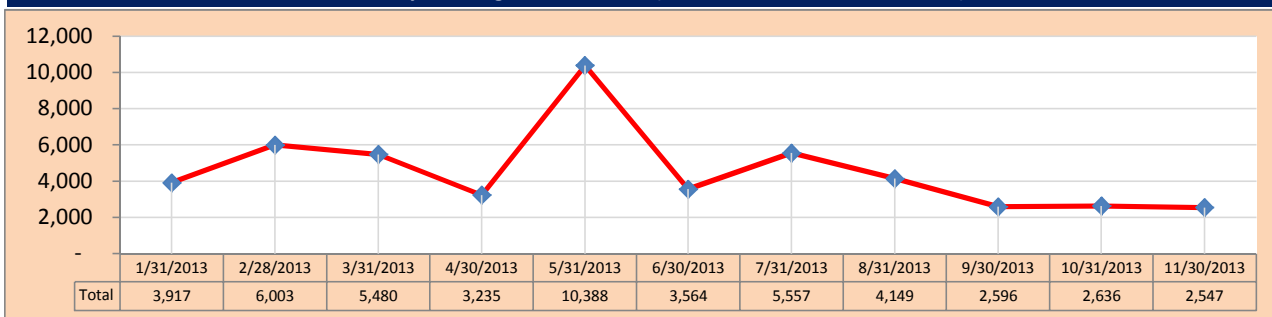

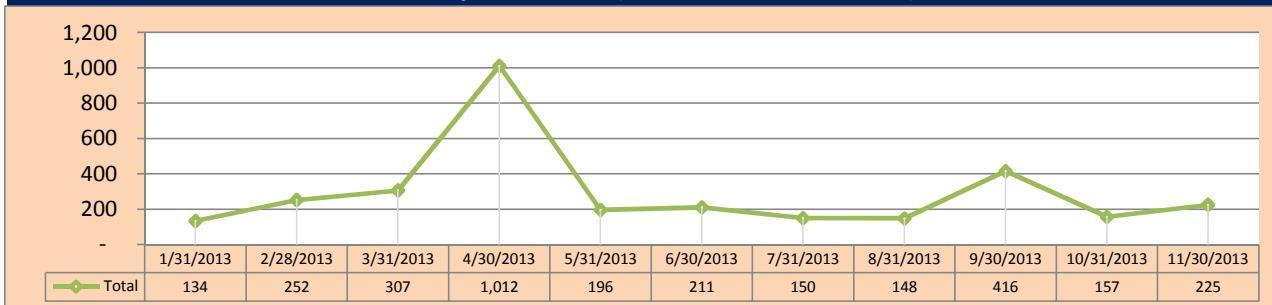

# Dollo Ado, Ethiopia

Population statistics as of 30 November 2013



**Total population:** 198,451 43,131

Dollo Ado came into the global picture in early 2009 when UNHCR opened the Bokolmanyio camp to accommodate refugees fleeing insecurity in Somalia. Now, five years on, the small town in south-eastern Ethiopia on the border with Somalia is the second largest refugee operation in the world accommodating more than 198,451 Somali refugees in five camps.

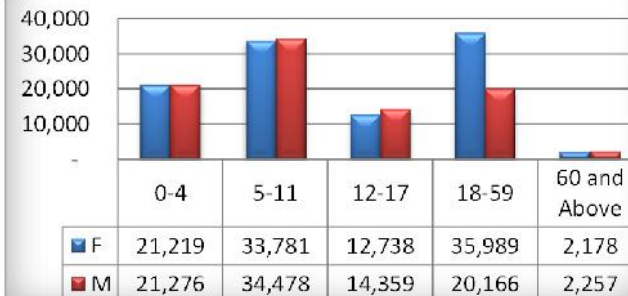

Camp Population by age and sex breakdown

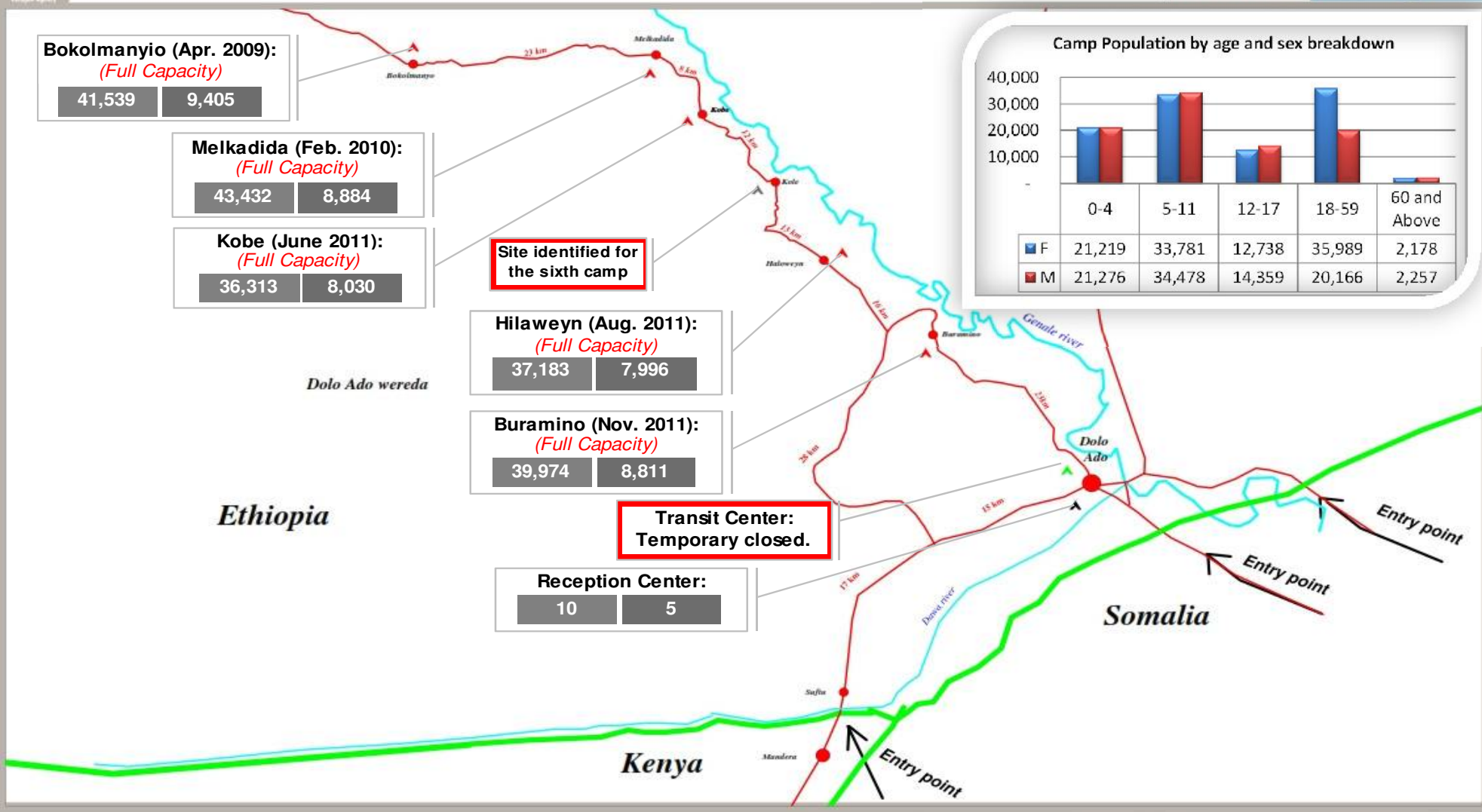

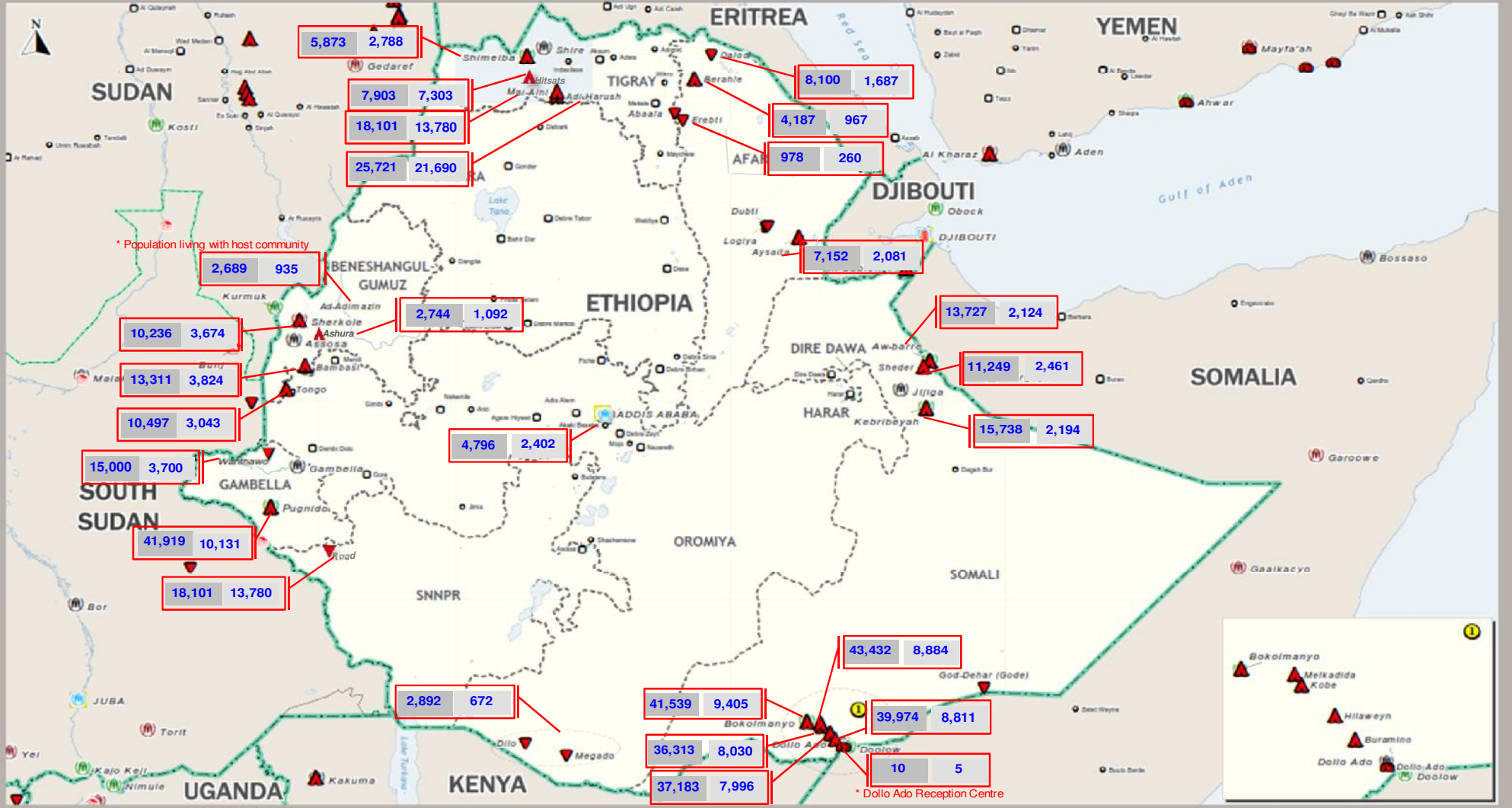

# Refugees in Ethiopia

Population figures: Estimation and Registration

The past two years have seen the refugee population in Ethiopia nearly double. This is due to the influx of more than 100,000 Somalis into the Dolo Aduro region, and a stream of Sudanese entering the country in the region around Assosa. A steady, but significant, number of Eritreans have also entered Ethiopia's Afar and Tigray regions. Ethiopia is now host to some 427,077 refugees; the largest groups are Somalis (56.22%), Sudanese (19.9%), South Sudanese (16.4%), and Eritreans (18.95%). In addition, there are a number of displaced people of concern from Kenya in the Moyale region, as well as urban refugees from several other countries, including Burundi; the Democratic Republic of the Congo (DRC); Djibouti; Rwanda; Uganda and Yemen.

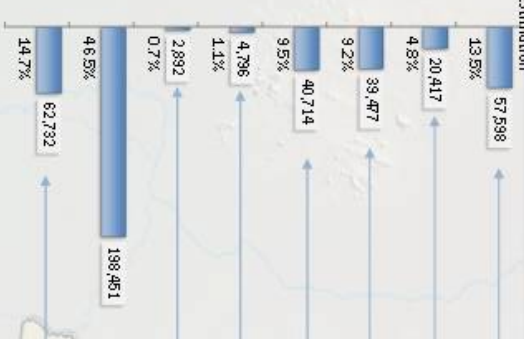

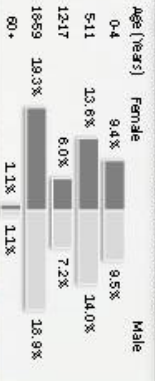
