


As of the reporting period, 12,948 movements were recorded throughout Somalia. These were attributed to forced evictions (3,852), insecurity (2,872), military activity (1,344) and lack of livelihood (1,304). Movements within Banadir remained significantly high with 4,245 reported in Dayniile, Hodan, Dharkenley, Johwar, Borama, Marka, Baardheere, Kurtunwaarey, Buur Hakaba, Bulo Burto, Jalalaqsi, Tayeeglow, Qoryooley districts. These movements are attributed to forced evictions in Dayniile, Dharkenley and Hodan districts. Military interventions reported in Buur Hakaba and Baardheere resulted in mass displacements into Yaaqshiid and Haliwaa districts of Mogadishu.

2,192 arrivals from Yemen were recorded in Bari. These were due to the ongoing security operations and air strikes in Yemen. The new arrivals were reported at the port of Bossaso. New arrivals from Yemen Djibouti and Saudi Arabia to Somali were attributed to forced returns from Saudi Arabia. Other arrivals reported in Woqooyi Galbeed were from Yemen.








