Current value

- 90% of refugees registered individually
- 50% of female members in camp management committees
- No refugees and asylum-seekers refouled
- Office has a SOP for SGBV
- 100% of newborns issued a birth certificate
- 100% of persons with specific needs assisted
- 2,100 kcal /person/day as food ration
- Hygienic kit distribution planned
- 63% of refugees in camps**
- 16% of refugees as urban**
- 15% of refugees in "Zone d'accueil"**
- 6% of refugees in sites**




Notes:

The wet feeding program was launched in January 2013 in order to improve the nutritional well-being. The aim is to prevent acute malnutrition among children under five by ensuring everyday a minimum of 800 Kcal
