

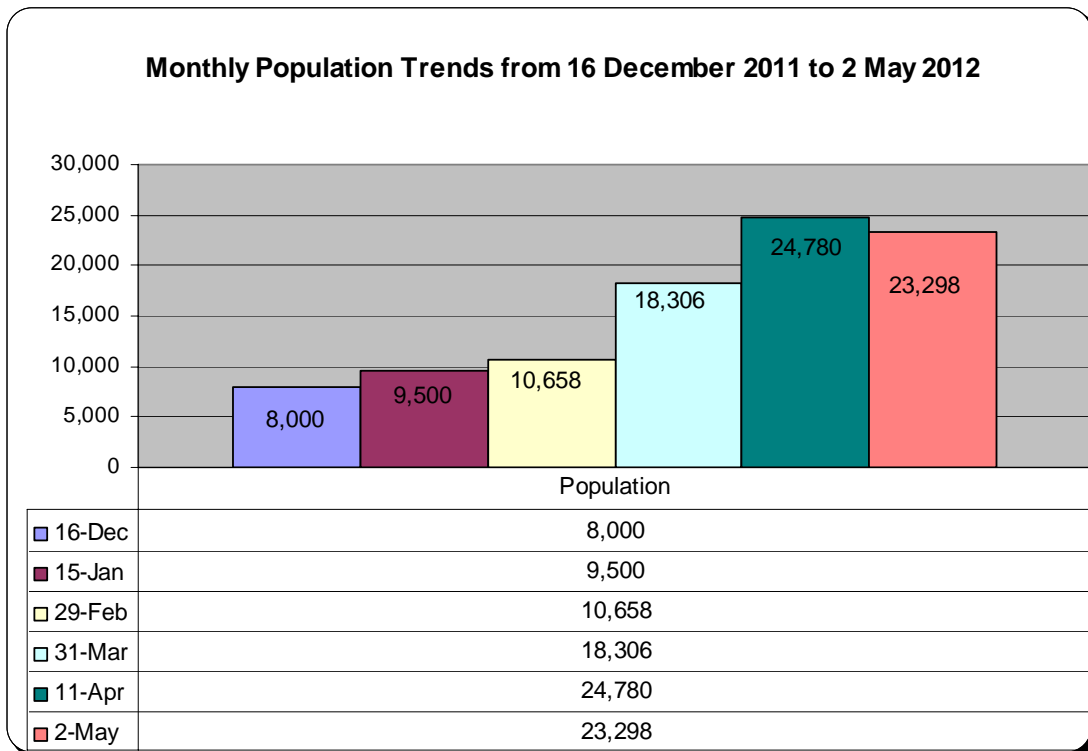


**United Nations Country Team in Turkey
Daily Situation Report on the Situation Pertaining to Syria**

May 2, 2012

It has been reported that as of May 2, 2012 total camp population is **23,298** persons with the arrival of 218 and return of 443 persons on May 1-2, 2012.

Increase in the arrivals from December 16, 2011 to May 2, 2012 is reflected below.



Currently arrivals from Syria are assisted in the border provinces of Hatay, Gaziantep, Kilis and Şanlıurfa.

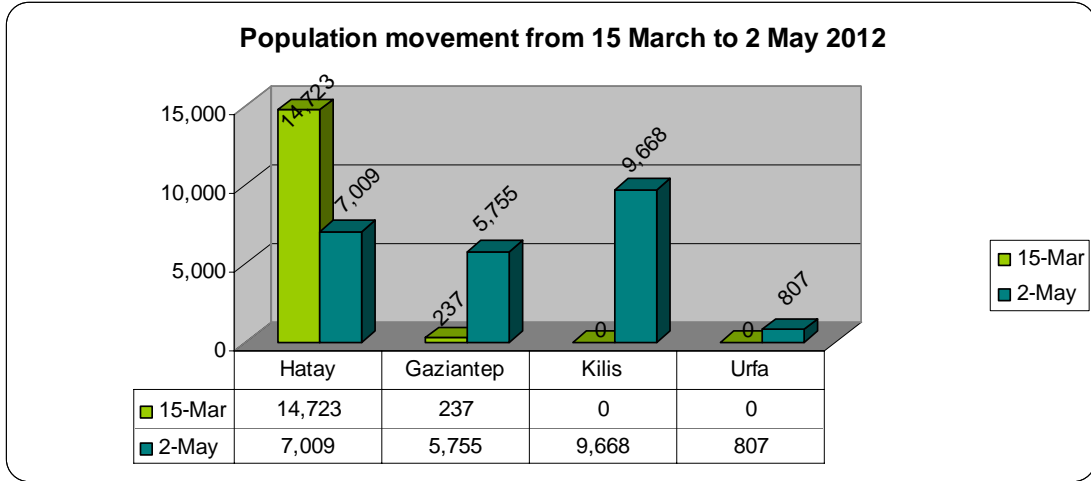
As of May 2, 2012 the city breakdown in the region is as follows:

- Hatay population¹: 7,009 individuals
- Gaziantep population in Islahiye²: 5,755 individuals.
- Kilis population in Öncüpınar container site: 9,668 individuals

¹: The population of the Kuyubaşı/Karbeyaz, Yayladağı 2 (YIBO), Altınözü I (TEKEL) and Reyhanlı camps in Hatay is moved to Islahiye camp in Gaziantep and to Öncüpınar container site in Kilis. It has been reported that these empty camps will be kept for while as standby and there is some use of these camps for new arrivals.

- Şanlıurfa population in Ceylanpınar: 807 individuals

Population movement from Hatay to Gaziantep (Islahiye Camp), Kilis (Öncüpınar Container site) and Şanlıurfa (Ceylanpınar), from March 15³ to May 2, 2012 is reflected below.



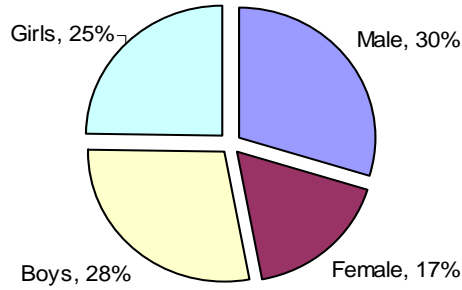
Please find below the map of the region including current 10 camps in Hatay, Kilis, Gaziantep and Şanlıurfa as May 2, 2012.



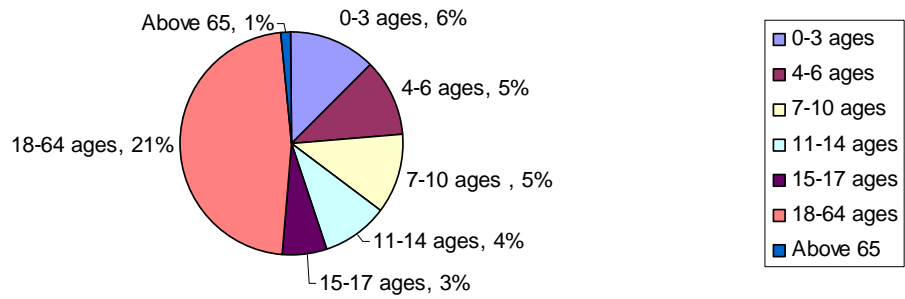

³ 15 March is the date of first movement took place from Hatay.

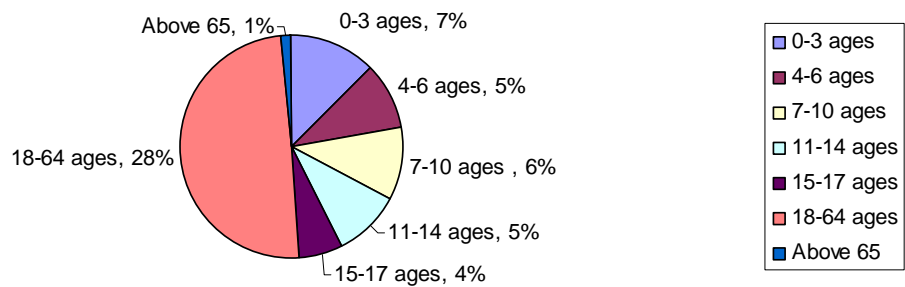
Gender and age percentage of the population as of 1 May 2012

1) Highlights:

- ❖ The local daily newspapers **Hududeli, Havadis, Kilis'in Sesi** and **Kent** reported that the Vice Prime Minister visited the container site and met with the

Officials. Following the meeting Vice PM took a tour in the camp and met with around 10 persons as community representatives. During press conference which took place after the visit; the Vice PM shared the information regarding the population and the camp settlements. He also mentioned that up until now around 150 million TL has been spent to protect and assist Syrians.

- ❖ It has been reported that the 2011 Nobel Peace Price winner, Ms. Tawakkul Karman came to Kilis to visit Öncüpınar Container site.
