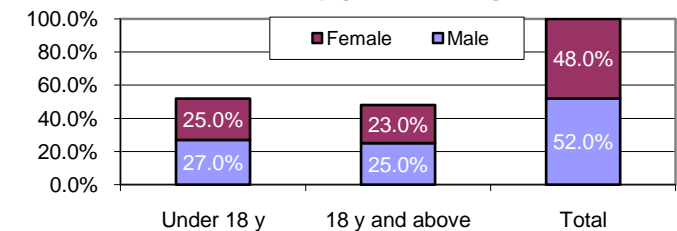

Highlights

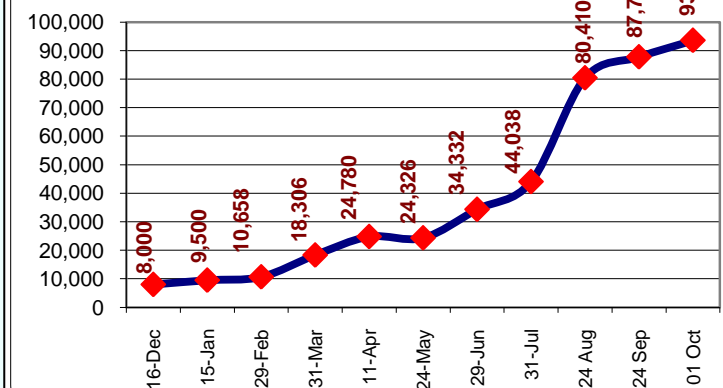
- There is no new official figures reported by the Government of Turkey since October 1, 2012. However according to the information from the Representative of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs in Kilis, with the latest new arrivals, the total number of Syrians accommodated in 14 camps operational in seven provinces and those undertaking medical treatment in hospitals is 95,030 as of September 2012 which is about 4% increase since the end of September 2012.
- During the clashes between Syrian Government Forces and opponent groups, Turkish town of Akçakale was hit by heavy artillery and reportedly five persons were killed and about 10 including two police officers were wounded. Reportedly angry groups of local people gathered in town and protested the Government of Turkey. It was also reported by the Government of Turkey after the crisis meeting that the attack was responded immediately under self-defense and the targets on the Syrian side were destroyed. Reportedly a parliamentary move was taken to get the constitutional authorization as needed for use when needed for cross border operations. UN Security Council was called to discuss and condemn the attack by Syria. UN Secretary-General asked Turkey to keep the communication lines with Damascus. NATO declared its support to Turkey.
- According to the information from local authorities in Akçakale there is no big movement of Syrians towards Turkey. 635 Syrians were registered and accommodated in Akçakale camp.
