


### Highlights

- No new official numbers reported by the Government of Turkey since November 21, 2012, but according to the information from local authorities (Ministry of Foreign Affairs/ Disaster and Emergency Management Presidency - AFAD) the total number of Syrians accommodated in 14 camps, in seven provinces increased to **129,849** persons on November 29, 2012. It was reported by the authorities that during the 48hrs of November 27-29, 2012, **1,056** Syrians were admitted from the borders and **401** Syrians have returned to Syria voluntarily.
- According to the Government officials, the capacity of the current operational camps is 126,500. Meanwhile, there are more than 129,000 Syrians in the camps. According to the latest numbers 38% of the total camps population is registered in two camps (Akçakale and Ceylanpınar) in Şanlıurfa province but some 12,000 are staying with their relatives in the nearby villages on permission from the officials.
- Due to the shortage of space in the current camps, additional camps are planned and construction is on going. The Government of Turkey reported that the two container sites, Nizip-2 camp in Gaziantep province with 5,000 capacity, and Harran-Kökenli in Şanlıurfa province with 10,000 capacity were under construction and expected to be completed by the end of 2012. Also, reportedly there are other container sites planned in Kilis-Elbeyli (up to 20,000), Osmaniye-Düzici (about 1,500-2,000 persons) as well as a tent camp in Adana and Malatya.
