

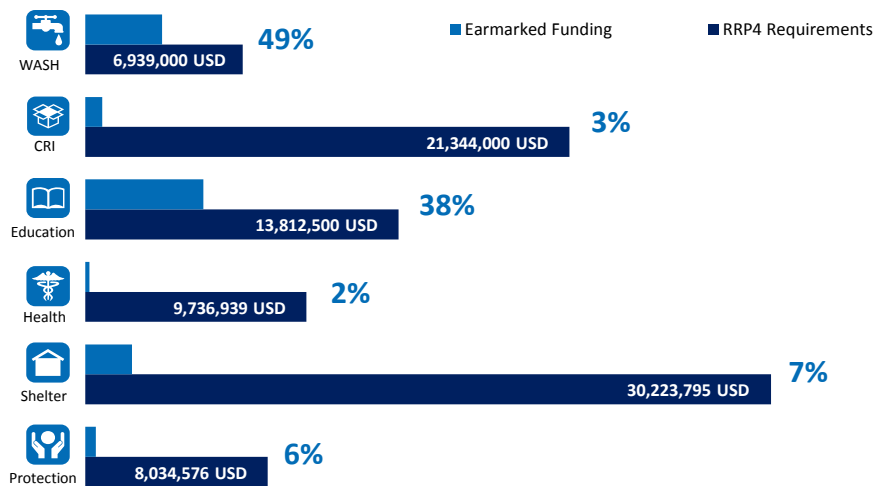

Monthly Highlights

- UNHCR registered 48,000 Syrian refugees, marking a 10,000 people increase in registration figures as compared to the previous month;
- WASH initiatives in the Bekaa this month included the construction of 114 latrines in different tented settlements by UNHCR and Action Contre La Faim (ACF);
- UNHCR andPremiere Urgence (PU-AMI) installed 2 water tanks and 7 garbage bins for the collection of solid waste, and constructed 7 emergency latrines at the Ouzai collective shelter;
- UNHCR and International Medical Corps (IMC) provided over 7,000 refugees with primary health care in clinics throughout the country. UNHCR and IMC facilitated the hospitalization of some 2,500 refugee patients
- 2,000 refugees benefitted from mental health services by UNHCR and its implementing partner IMC.

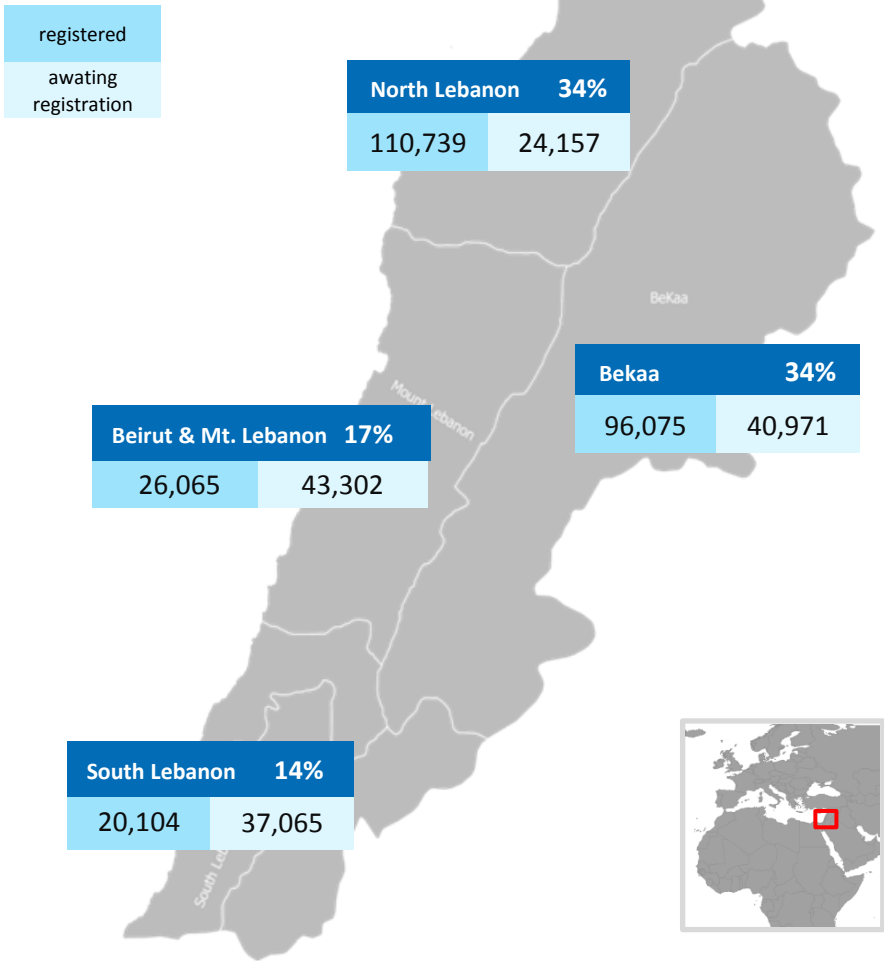
