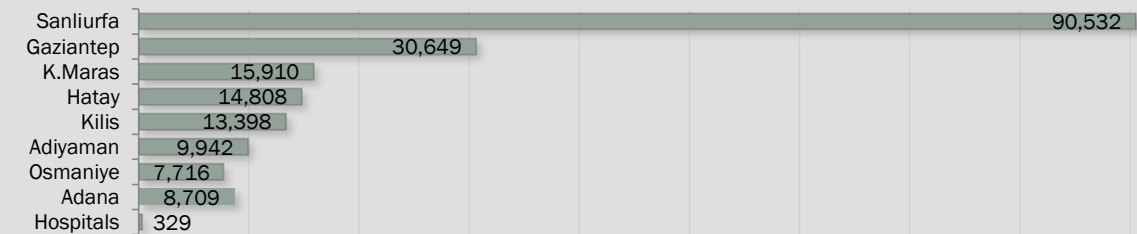


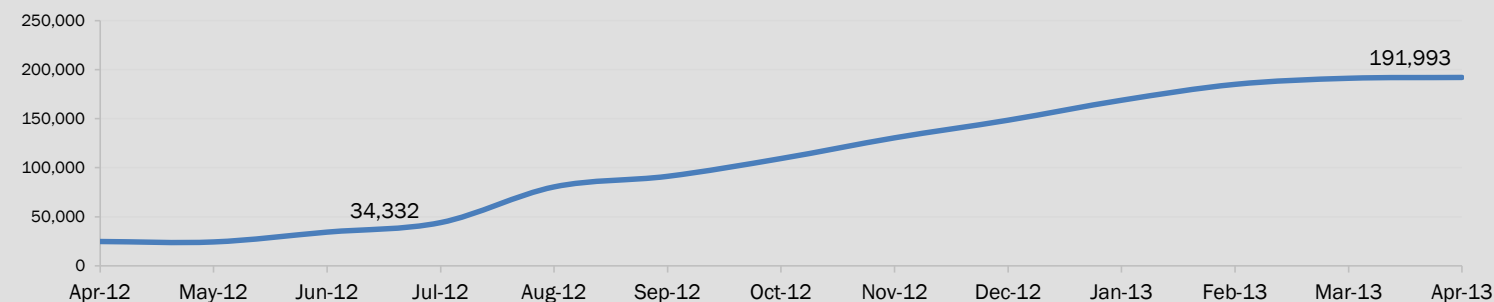
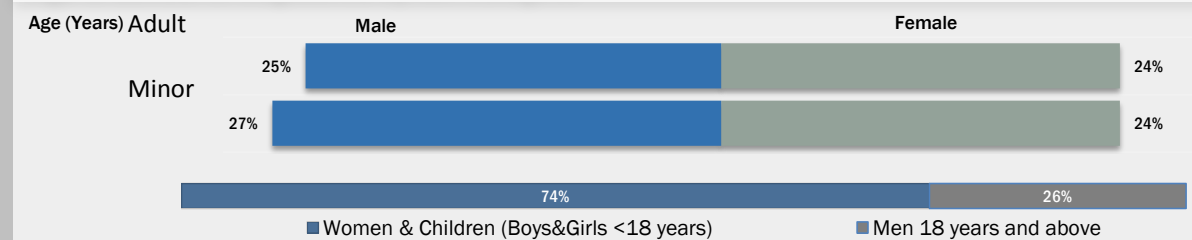

Highlights

- On 31 March 2013, the Disaster and Emergency Management Agency (AFAD) announced that total number of Syrians registered and accommodated in the 17 camps in 8 provinces is 191,152. This is about 29% increase since the beginning of 2013.
- AFAD reports that during the week of 25 March 02 April 2013, 3,543 new arrival Syrians were registered and accommodated in the camps, while 2,699 Syrians returned to Syria voluntarily.
- MSF Spain opened a clinic under the auspices of Helsinki Citizens Assembly (HCA) to provide medical assistance to Syrians living in urban in Kilis province. The Clinic was officially opened by the Governor of Kilis on 26 March 2013.
- National media reported that a fire broke out in Akcakale camp early morning on 27 March 2013, probably due to an electrical problem. Reportedly one person died and two people were injured. Following the fire, a demonstration occurred in the camp, to which security officials responded. The incident was covered by local and international media. UNHCR Ankara remains in close consultation with the Gov. of Turkey on this incident and the follow up.
- The recently opened container site Nizip-2 (5,000 capacity) is almost 80% full. Nizip-2 Camp management reported that some 190 Syrians (Circassian origin) were received following an agreement to move these Syrians from Lebanon to Turkey as organized by the Government of Turkey.
- The camp management in Harran organized a Youth Committee beside the Refugee Committee who works closely with the camp management. UNHCR Team is also invited to participate in these meetings between the Refugee Committees and Camp Management.
- WFP and Kizilay will aim to increase assistance from 34,700 to reach around 80,000 beneficiaries with the e-food card programme in April. The Government confirmed to WFP and TRC that camps will be ready for the programme to begin in Nizip 1 (10,000), Nizip 2 (5,000 people), Adana (13,500), Gaziantep-Karkamis (7,000), and Gaziantep-Islahiye (9,000) in the middle of April; and Osmaniye/Düzici (4,000 people) is ready but will be kept vacant. Cards have been printed for Nizip 1 and are being prepared for the other camps. UNHCR is working with Kizilay to ensure household cooking facilities are installed.
- UNHCR Field Teams continue to visit the camps and observe regularly a percentage of the VolReps interviews conducted by Gov. of Turkey. UNHCR Teams also in close cooperation with the camp management to provide technical advice and support on protection issues and camp management.
