



## Age & Gender of Registered Syrian Refugees




## Population Trends



## Highlights

- No new official figures have been announced by the Government of Turkey. The Official figures of Syrians registered and accommodated in the 17 camps in 8 provinces is 191,993 persons as announced by AFAD on 02 April 2013. This figure includes the 329 Syrians under medical treatment in the hospitals. According to the official figures by AFAD, the number of Syrians in the camps increased by 29% since beginning of 2013.
- According to information from local officials, some 48,000 Syrians have been registered and issued ID cards by the Coordination Centers in Gaziantep, Nizip and Kilis and some more than 33,000 Syrians are given appointments to be registered until Nov. 2013. UNHCR was informed that the Coordination Center in Sanliurfa is also planned to be operational during April and will start to register non-camp Syrians.
- According to various sources, areas approximately 10 km across Kilis border were air bombed by Syrian planes on 8 April. UNHCR closely followed the situation with the local officials as well as the NGOs, and reportedly there are no population movements towards the Turkish border.
- During the vol-rep interviews observed by UNHCR Field Teams, several people reported that they would like to return because they were informed by their relatives that their places of origin is safe.
- Shortage of space in the camps continue to be a major challenge for the local authorities. While admissions at the borders are on going, camp officials are approached by spontaneous arrivals who claim to have immediate family members in the camps. Once it is confirmed with the family members in the camps, new arrivals are admitted on the condition of sharing the same tent.
- The most recently opened tent site in Adana Saricam, has reportedly reached over 9,000 people. While the camp was planned for over 10,000, due to shortage of land and priority given to social areas the camp capacity will be less than 10,000 persons.
- According to various local officials, there are several camps planned and are under construction in various places like Mersin, Malatya, Osmaniye/Duzici, Sanliurfa, Kilis/Elbeyli. Recently it was also reported that Mardin is also under consideration for establishment of a camp.
