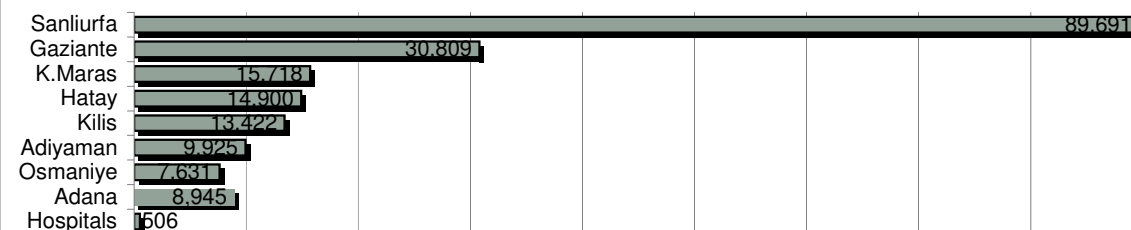
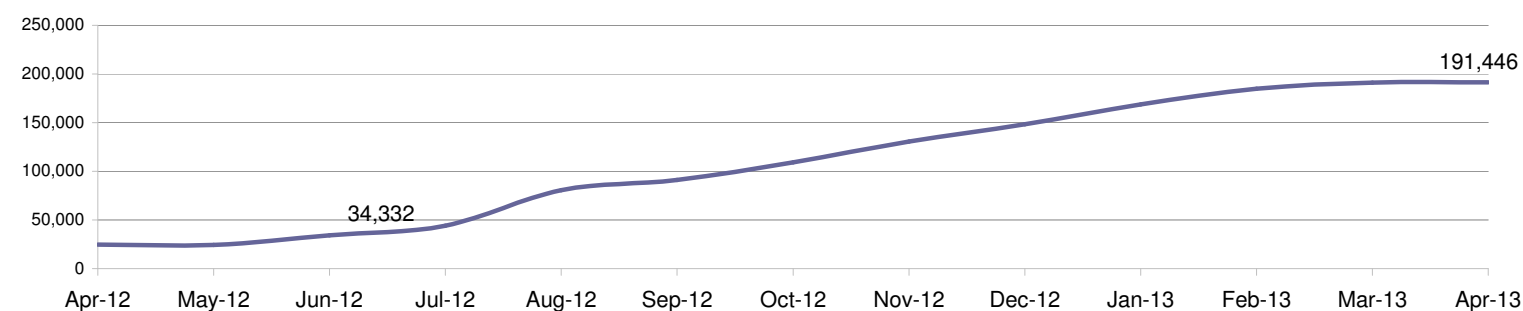
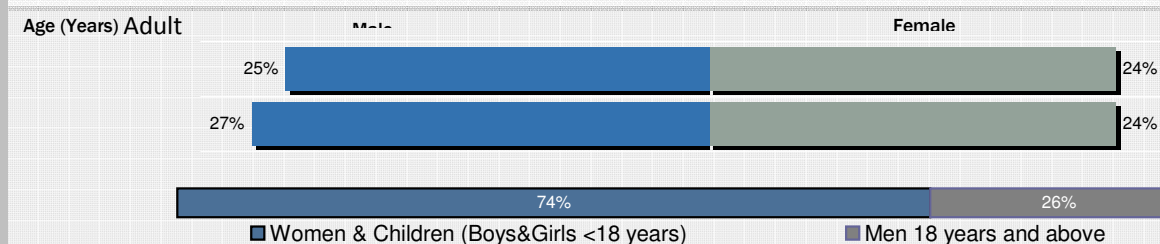

Highlights

- On 16 April 2013, AFAD - Disaster and Emergency Management Agency of Government of Turkey announced that the total number of Syrians registered and accommodated in 17 camps in 8 provinces is 191,446, including 506 Syrians under medical treatment in the hospitals. This is a 29% increase since the beginning of 2013. A total of 1,413 Syrians were admitted to Turkey for camp placement during the 24 hour period of 15-16 April 2013. AFAD reports that during the first half of April 2013 some 1,565 Syrians voluntarily returned to Syria.
- On the 15th of April, the United Nations World Food Programme (WFP) in partnership with the Turkish Red Crescent (TRC) expanded its food assistance programme into four new camps in Turkey doubling the number of Syrians refugees it now supports in Turkish camps to 80,000 people. In line with the Government of Turkey's request for WFP to provide food assistance to all Syrians in camps in Turkey, WFP and TRC started the programme in the camps of Adana, Islahiye, Karkamis and Nizip1. With this expansion, WFP and TRC are now supporting over 40% of the total camp population working in 11 out of the total 17 camps in Turkey.
- While the registration of the Syrians residing in private accommodations in urban areas in Gaziantep province is on going by AFAD and Local Governorate, UNHCR was informed that a similar Coordination Center will be established in Sanliurfa soon to register the Syrians living in Sanliurfa province.
- UNHCR Field Teams are informed that some of the Syrians residing in Islahiye camp have been relocated to Nizip-1 and Nizip-2 camps because a school is being built in the same area where their tents were erected. During the visits to the camps, UNHCR Field Teams are advocating for refugee representation and participation dialogues with camp management.
- On 13 April 2013, the Executive Director and Under-Secretary-General of UNFPA Dr. Babatunde Osotimehin visited the Nizip-2 Container site, and met with some of the refugees and discussed possible future operational activities in the area of public health.
