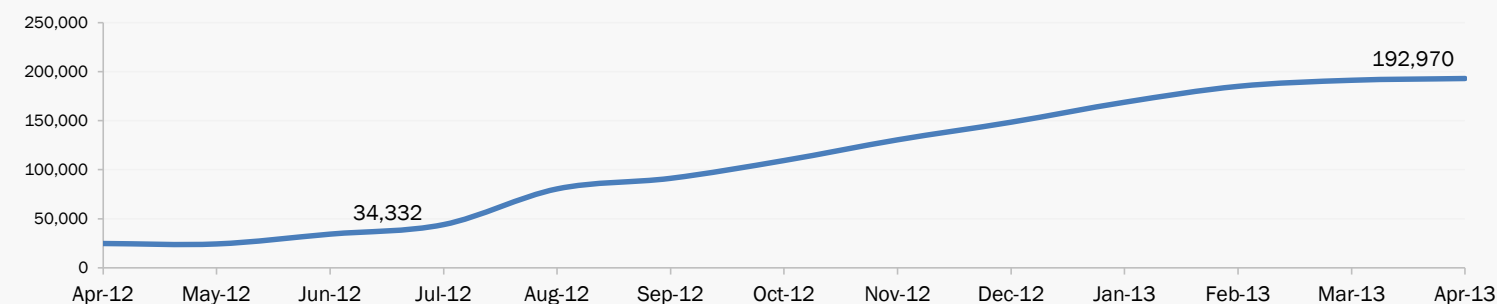
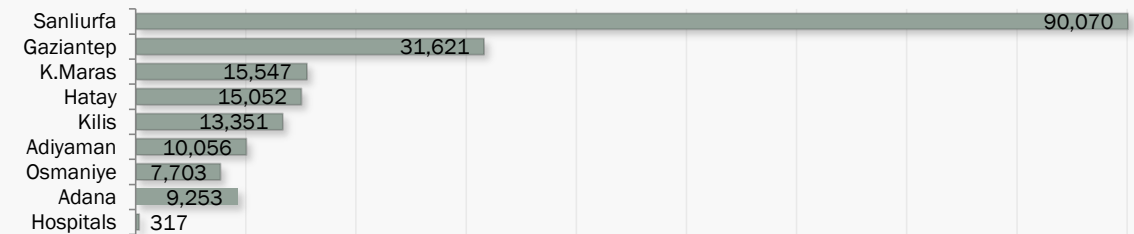


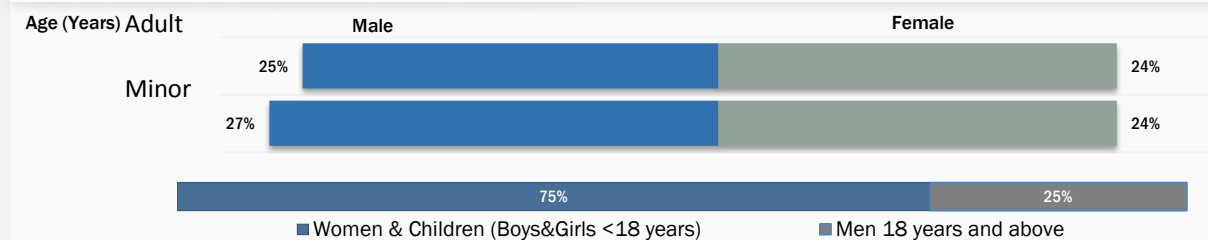

Age & Gender of Registered Syrian Refugees

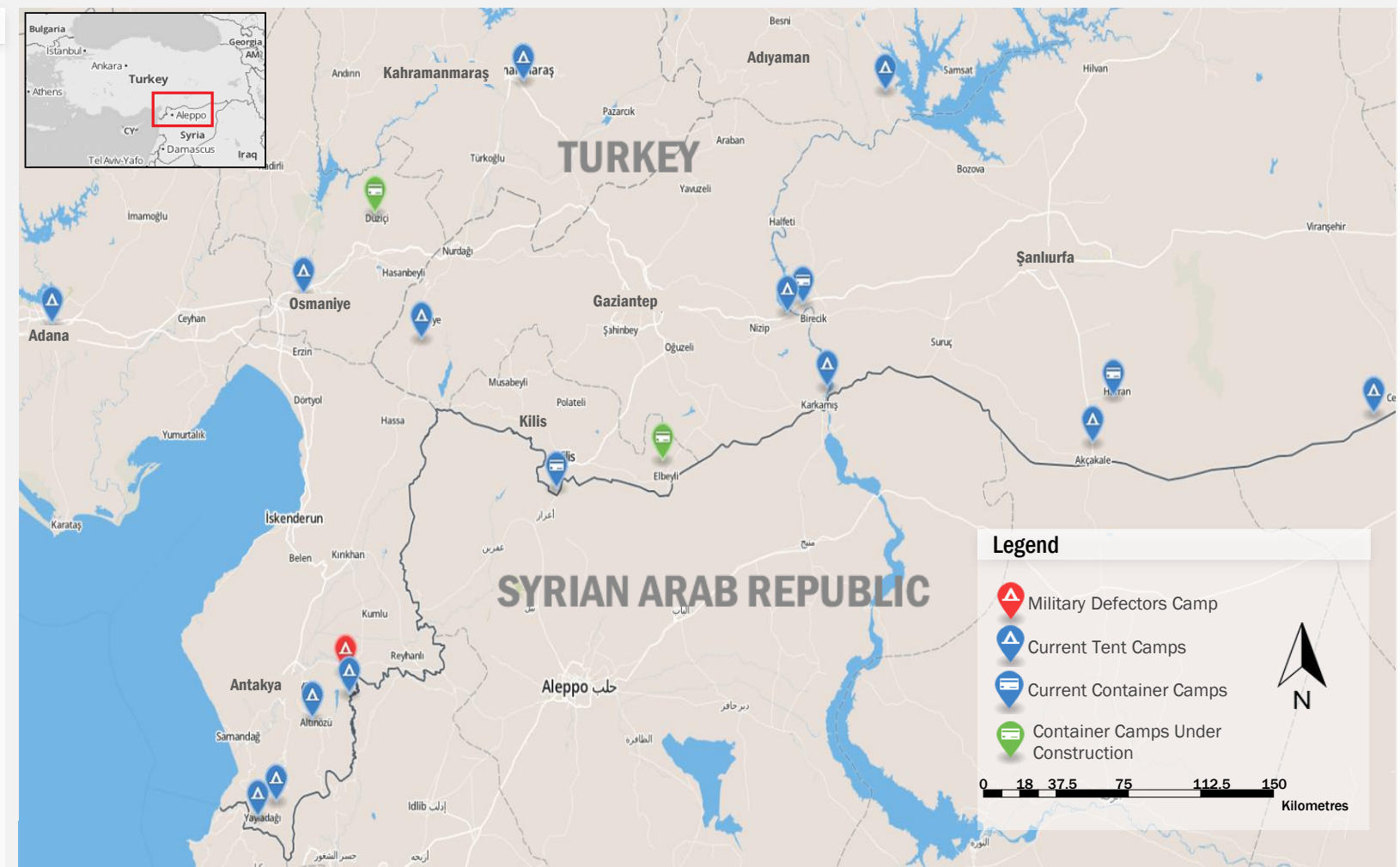


Highlights

- On 30 April 2013, AFAD - the Disaster and Emergency Management Agency of Government of Turkey announced that the total number of Syrians registered and accommodated in 17 camps in 8 provinces is 192,970 including 317 Syrians under medical treatment in the hospitals.
- Reportedly during the 48 hours of 29 to 30 April 2013, 591 new arrival Syrians were registered and accommodated in the camps while 50 Syrians voluntarily returned to Syria during the same period of time. With these recent new arrivals, the total number of arrivals during the first 4 months of 2013, reached over 56,000 (56,277) persons and the total of voluntary returns reached over 27,000 (27,075) persons according to the information available from AFAD. The cumulative increase in the number of Syrians registered in the camps is 30% since beginning of 2013.
- The AFAD Coordination center in Gaziantep continues to register the non-camp Syrians in Gaziantep. Reportedly all the newly approached Syrians are registered immediately and no new appointments are issued. In Hatay Reyhanli, the UNHCR Field Team was informed by local officials about some 25,000 Syrians living in Reyhanli town. Reportedly the majority of these Syrians are living with their relatives, while some of them are living in private accommodations and public buildings (wedding halls). UNHCR Team visited one of the public premises where approximately 700-1000 persons are living. The conditions look very challenging although some basic humanitarian assistance (food, medical assistance) is provided. Increased UN support to urban refugees is under consultation.
- On 30 April 2013, it was reported that an explosion occurred in one of the IDP camps across Reyhanli border (Bab Al Hawa). More than 50 people (of whom the majority were under the age of 8 years) were evacuated to Turkey for medical treatment. Two of the wounded subsequently died from their injuries and many others remain in critical condition. According to the sub-governor of Reyhanli, there are several camps across Reyhanli border and basic humanitarian assistance is provided by the Government of Turkey through Kizilay at zero point.
- UNHCR tents donated to Kizilay have arrived in Ceylanpinar, and the UNHCR Field Team was informed by local officials in the camp that some of these tents will be used in the new camp in Viransehir, which is under construction and expected to be operational by end of June.
