





Age & Gender of Registered Syrian Refugees



Highlights

- On 20 May 2013, AFAD - the Disaster and Emergency Management Agency of Government of Turkey announced that the total number of Syrians registered and accommodated in 17 camps in 8 provinces has increased to 194,783 including 333 Syrians receiving medical treatment in hospitals.
- AFAD reported that during the last 24 hrs of 20-21 May, 391 new arrival Syrians were registered and accommodated in the camps while 323 Syrians voluntarily returned to Syria.
- During meetings with local authorities in Osmaniye, UNHCR was informed that 650 Syrian families are living in urban areas in Osmaniye and are being assisted through the NGO platform which involves around 20 national NGOs regularly provide humanitarian assistance to Syrians. Reportedly some 50 Syrians who relocated themselves spontaneously from Reyhanli town and moved to Osmaniye are also receiving assistance from the platform, in particular in the form of affordable housing.
- The UNHCR Field Team in Hatay was informed by the Deputy Mayor that the Municipality of Antakya is including the Syrians living in Antakya town center in their existing assistance mechanisms. Syrians living in the urban areas are among others provided with clothes, donated house goods. Reportedly the municipality has a soup-kitchen where Syrians can receive hot meals. A local NGO based in Antakya provides bread to the most vulnerable families.
- Local authorities in Karkamis camp informed UNHCR that the newly recruited social workers have started to work in the camp and are planning establish community centers for both men and women. UNHCR Field Teams will continue to provide technical expertise and share good practices in refugee response.
- The UNHCR Field Team visiting the Kilis Oncupinar Container site also observed that there is an increasing number of Syrians in Kilis city center. It was reported by local authorities that an estimated number of 3,000 Syrians are living in makeshift tents in the main park of Kilis. AFAD is registering these Syrians and planning to accommodate them in the new camp which is about to be completed in Kilis - Elbeyli with a capacity of up to 20,000.
