







Highlights

- UNHCR has not received any updated statistics from AFAD today.
- On 29 May, IOM provided 9 dishwashing containers that will be transported to Mardin province. The containers will arrive on 1 June and will be handed over to the Governor of Mardin who is coordinating services related to the camp in the area. Each container is equipped with 12 sinks, and one 300-litre tank which is heated by a solar system of three solar tubes. Water will be supplied by Mardin's Public Utility Services. The camp which is currently under construction is expected to accommodate 10,000 Syrians. The provision of the container units will improve the water and sanitation services available to residents, reduce water wastage and improve drainage on the site.
- In Kahramanmaraş camp, primary and secondary education is available and Syrian volunteer teachers are working within these schools. The management is planning to open high school education as of September 2013. Vocational courses such as sewing, clothing, TOMER language courses are ongoing in camp area for the residences of the camp. Internal Disease Clinic, Emergency Section and Pediatrician, 3 polyclinic services, dental service (volunteer Syrian dentist works in there), emergency serving 7/24 are available as health services in the camp. The WFP programme will start in this camp as of 1 June 2013.
- A monthly survey among the 210 Security Staff of Nizip-1 tent to collect their opinion of Syrian residents. The Security Forces Unit conducts this survey as a preventive measure in order to avoid any possible misconduct or abuse of authority from the Security Staff and raise awareness about daily work among Syrian residents. The Security Forces have also put in place a "buddy system", which operates as a support system between colleagues.
- An Arabic Literacy Course for Syrian Adults is to begin in July in the school building of Karkamis Camp. The Coordinator of the School informed the UNHCR Team that the enrolment of the trainees will take place in June. The training program will be provided by the Arabic Teachers. The School Coordinator expects a high number of participants for the training program. Besides, the school building will be utilized as the display area for the exhibitions which will cover the items produced by Syrians in the vocational training courses. The School Coordinator added that participants will find an opportunity to put these items on sale as well.
- Adana Saricam Camp: The fire department of the Adana Saricam Camp organised training for Syrians students on the rules of fighting fires and how to use the fire extinguishers. The rate of participation was very high and the participants seemed very satisfied with the information provided.
