

Highlights

- On 12 July 2013, AFAD - the Disaster and Emergency Management Agency of Government of Turkey - announced that the total number of Syrians registered and assisted in 20 camps in 10 provinces was 200,001 including 523 Syrians receiving medical treatment in hospitals. According to an information note released by AFAD, 649 new arrival Syrians were admitted and accommodated in the camps reported that during the last 24hrs (10-11 July), 459 new arrivals were admitted and registered in the camps, and some 665 Syrians voluntarily returned to Syria during the 24hrs of 11-12 July. No new numbers were released by AFAD since 12 July 2013.
- While the camp population remains stable at around 200,000, the overall number of non-camp Syrians registered and counted by the local police in Hatay and AFAD Coordination centers in Gaziantep and Sanliurfa provinces increased by 10,626 and reached to 212,788 persons, which also includes about 19,700 who are scheduled to be registered by AFAD Coordination Center in Gaziantep province. While the registration of non-camp Syrians is ongoing, the estimation of various local officials (AFAD, Police, Governorates) as well as NGOs who are providing support in various cities (Kilis, Gaziantep, Urfa and Hatay), is that the number of non-camp Syrians is over 400,000.
- In Sanliurfa province, the AFAD Coordination Center is conducting the registration of non-camp Syrians within Urfa province and issuing ID cards, while the registration in towns are done through their representative and a tentative document is provided to the beneficiaries for them to have access to services. UNHCR Field Team was informed by local officials in Siverek town in Urfa province that some 100 families (about 600 people) have been counted and assisted through the Social Assistance Solidarity Foundation (SSAF). Reportedly the sub-governorate of Siverek estimates 1,500 or more Syrians are living in Siverek town. The authorities stated that their main challenge in the census and registration activities is that Syrians are scattered in about 600 villages/hamlets of Siverek.
- Both in Ceylanpinar and Islahiye camps, UNHCR Teams were informed that all the UNHCR procured items (fridges, kitchen sets and kitchen cabinets) were received and distributed to the beneficiaries. In Islahiye the camp management is planning to replace some 250 of the old tents with UNHCR tents. In Ceylanpinar the camp officials confirmed that they have received 4,250 tents of which all UNHCR donated and will start to replace the old tents by September.
