

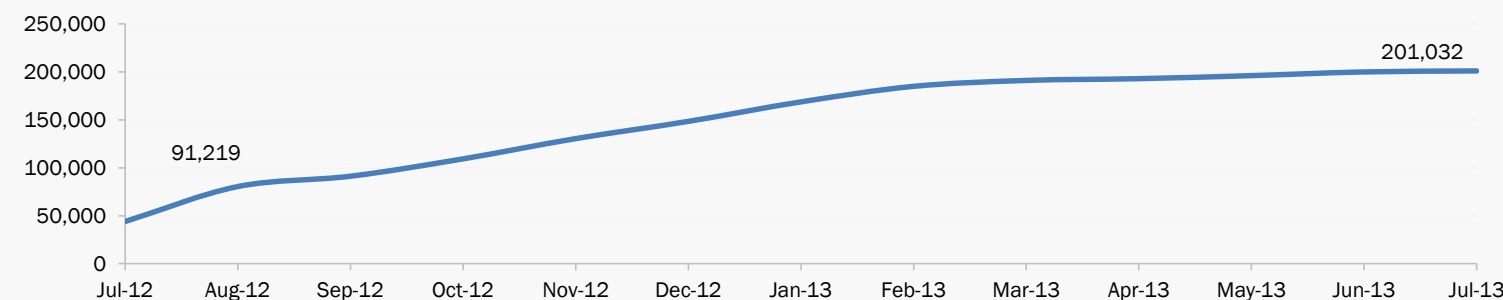

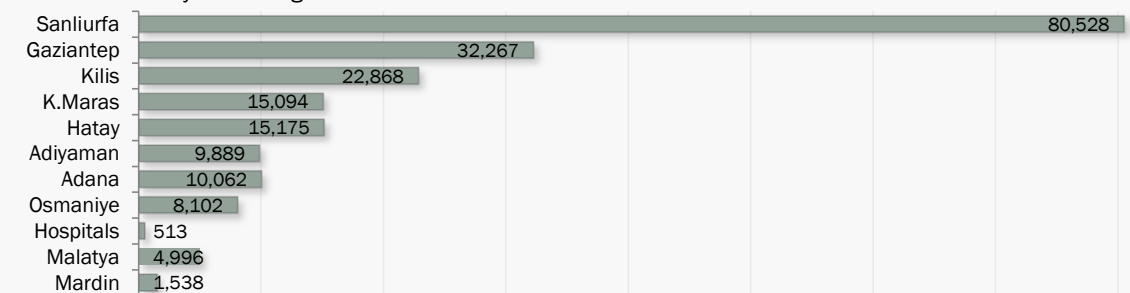

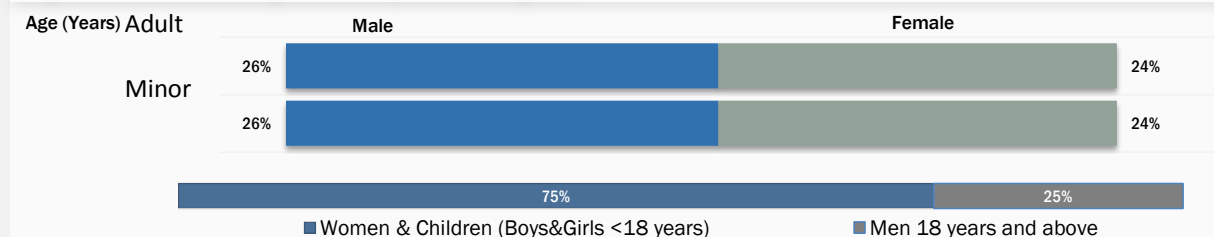

The number of Syrians living in the Urban Area are not included

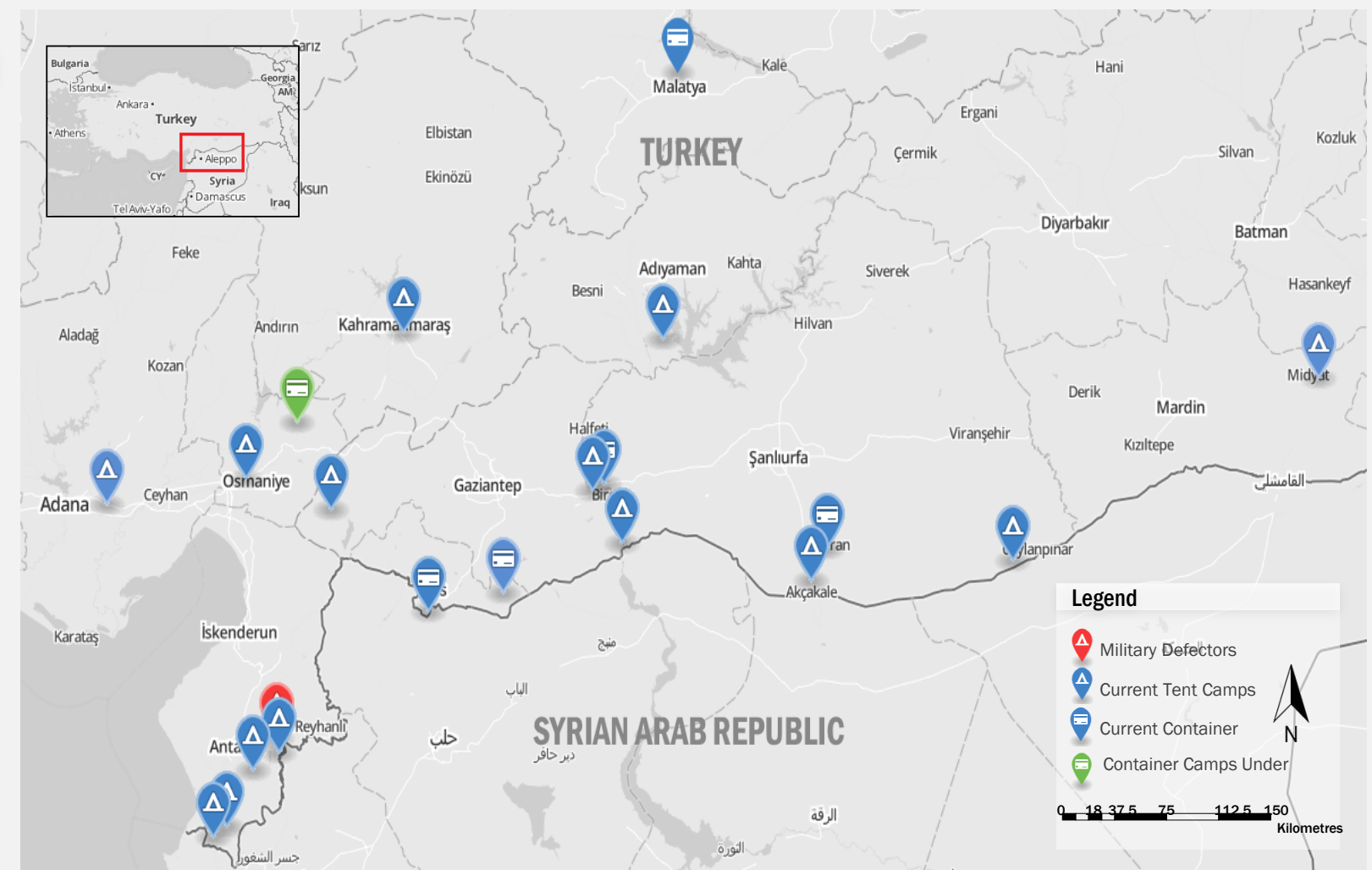


Age & Gender of Registered Syrian Refugees



Highlights

- On 16 July 2013, AFAD - the Disaster and Emergency Management Agency of Government of Turkey - announced that the total number of Syrians registered and assisted in 20 camps in 10 provinces is 201,032, including 513 Syrians receiving medical treatment in hospitals. AFAD reported that during the last 24 hrs, i.e., 15-16 July 2013, 537 Syrians were admitted and registered in the camps while 550 Syrians voluntarily returned to Syria.
- The WFP and Turkish Red Crescent E-Food card programme will start on July 17 in Adiyaman camp; this will be the fourteenth camp where the programme is operational. Training and information sessions for the market managers have been completed and preparations for the two markets inside the camp are being finalized. With the inclusion of Adiyaman camp, the WFP and TRC programme now reaches over 110,000 beneficiaries.
- In Kahramanmaraş, one of the local NGOs estimates that some 12,000 Syrians are living in Kahramanmaraş urban. The local NGO informed UNHCR Field team that they are providing food assistance to vulnerable locals including Syrians and other non-Syrian asylum-seekers and refugees living there. The same NGO reported that they also provided clothing assistance to some 2,600 Syrians in 2012 and organized the communal circumcision of about 80 Syrian children in Kahramanmaraş camp.
- As the camp schools are in summer break, the school manager of Karkamis camp and the youth committee in Kilis Oncupinar camp informed UNHCR Field teams that they are organizing additional vocational courses in the camps using the school premises. In both camps, with the support from the camp officials and upon request, Arabic classes for the illiterate population of the camps have been organized. Reportedly some 30 individuals in Karkamis camp and 238 in Kilis Oncupinar have been registered for courses.
- It was reported in the national media that fights broke out between the oppositions and the Kurdish groups in Ras-Al Ayn across Ceylanpinar border town and reportedly 4 wounded Syrian the fighters were brought to Turkey for medical treatment. It is also reported in the media that a 15 year-old and a 17 year-old Turkish nationals were also wounded in Ceylanpinar by a stray bullet and the 17 year-old is reportedly died this morning. Reportedly the local authorities announced to the public to keep away from the border area.
