





Age & Gender of Registered Syrian Refugees



Highlights

- On 11 August 2013, AFAD - the Disaster and Emergency Management Agency of Government of Turkey - announced that the total number of Syrians registered and assisted in 20 camps in 10 provinces was 200,175, including 473 Syrians receiving medical treatment in hospitals. AFAD reported that during the period of 07-11 Aug. 2013, 2,356 Syrians were admitted and registered in the camps while 2,305 Syrians voluntarily returned to Syria.
- Despite the heavy fights across the border from Ceylanpinar and heavy bombing of the Syrian Government near Azaz town across Kilis borders after the oppositions reportedly captured the Mennagh Airport, there has been no influx reported neither by the Government officials nor in the media. The official numbers of AFAD during the period of Eid Al-Fitr reports no increase in the number of arrivals.
- Mardin Midyat camp had reportedly received first non-Muslim families during the period of Eid El-Fitr. The camp officials informed UNHCR Field Team that 12 non-Muslim Syrians were settled in the Midyat camp during the week of Eid Al-Fitr. The local officials in Mardin and Midyat informed UNHCR that there are many more Syrians living in Midyat town center than those who live in the villages.
- The officials of Social Assistance and Solidarity Foundation (SASF) Office in Midyat informed UNHCR Team that their staff are conducting an enumeration exercise visiting the Syrians' houses door-to-door. Reportedly the data is sent to AFAD when requested. The officials informed that no ID cards are issued; however a document with a photo is provided to those who are enumerated by SASF staff. Reportedly cash assistance was provided to some 1,050 Syrians and also food packages were requested by SASF office to be distributed to the needy families. Kizilay also provided clothing to the needy Syrians.
- UNHCR Field Team was informed by the SASF Officials and the Directorate of National Education Office in Mardin that there are several Syrian children attending to the Turkish schools as guest students. Reportedly because the education language is in Turkish, additional Turkish classes are organized for these children during the weekends so they can advance the level of their Turkish language and adapt to the education level in the schools.
