





## Age & Gender of Registered Syrian Refugees



## Highlights

- On 14 August 2013, AFAD - the Disaster and Emergency Management Agency of Government of Turkey - announced that the total number of Syrians registered and assisted in 20 camps in 10 provinces was **200,780**, including **615** Syrians receiving medical treatment in hospitals. AFAD reported that during the 24hrs of 13-14, 1,006 Syrians were admitted and registered in the camps while 997 Syrians voluntarily returned to Syria.
- The local officials in Maras informed UNHCR Field team that the number of non-Camp Syrians in Maras increased to about 8,300. Reportedly the police does the enumeration through the local administrators (mukhtars) and registers them. No identification card is issued to those registered, however a document is provided and the people are referred to camps outside of Maras.
- In Nizip town, upon request from the local officials, UNHCR Field Team observed the voluntary return interviews of 47 Syrians who have been living in the mosque and decided to return to Syria. Reportedly, there are about 200-300 Syrians living in the mosque and they stated that they came from Idlib and Hama 20-25 days ago. Local officials are trying to find a solution to accommodate them in the camps.
- Local security officials in Akcakale informed the UNHCR Field Team that due to the recent security situation in Raqqa region and especially the shelling and bombing in Telabyad and fights in Ras Al Ayn, on Monday and Tuesday some 3,000 new arrivals of both passport and non-passport holders have been admitted and on a daily basis about 1,500 persons will be admitted. Reportedly, of these new admissions more than 200 have approached Akcakale camp but were referred to Ceylanpinar.
- In Altinozu Tekel Camp of Hatay, the camp management informed UNHCR Team that they have elected the refugee representatives among the camp residents. Reportedly 7 Representatives were elected by the community who will be working with camp management to assist them on various issues in the camp. The Altinozu Boynuyogun camp already had representatives working with the camp management. The camp management informed UNHCR Team that during the Eid Al-Fitr Holiday some 350 Syrians were given permission for long period but as of this week they have switched to the daily permission system.
