

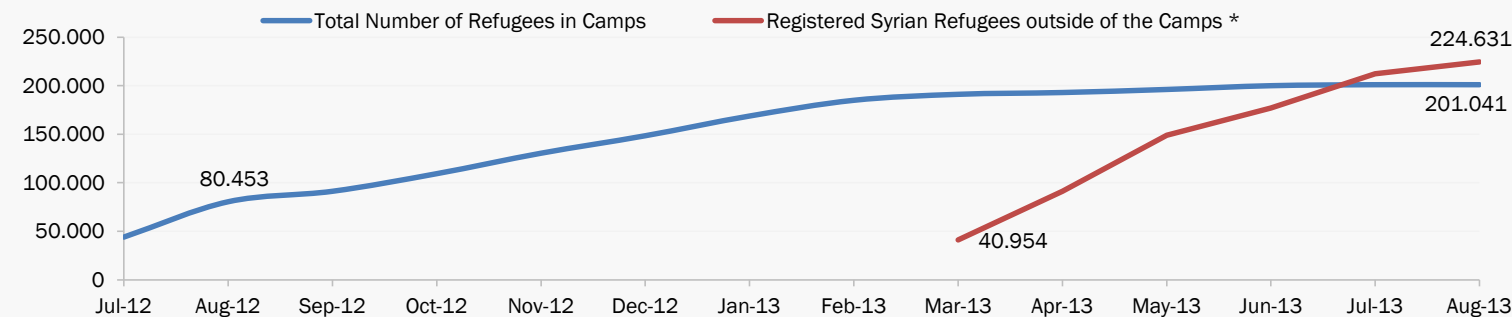

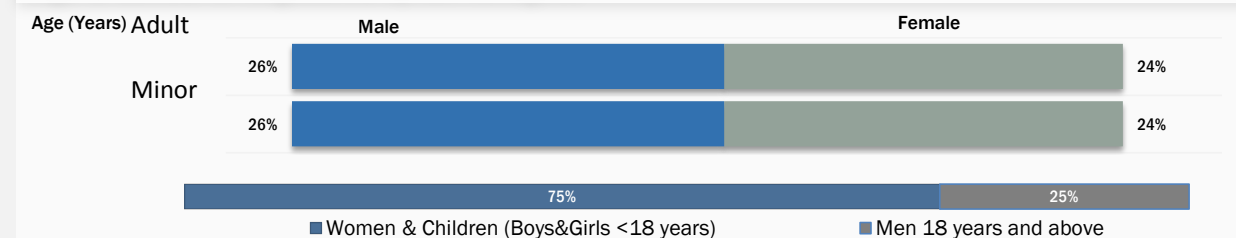

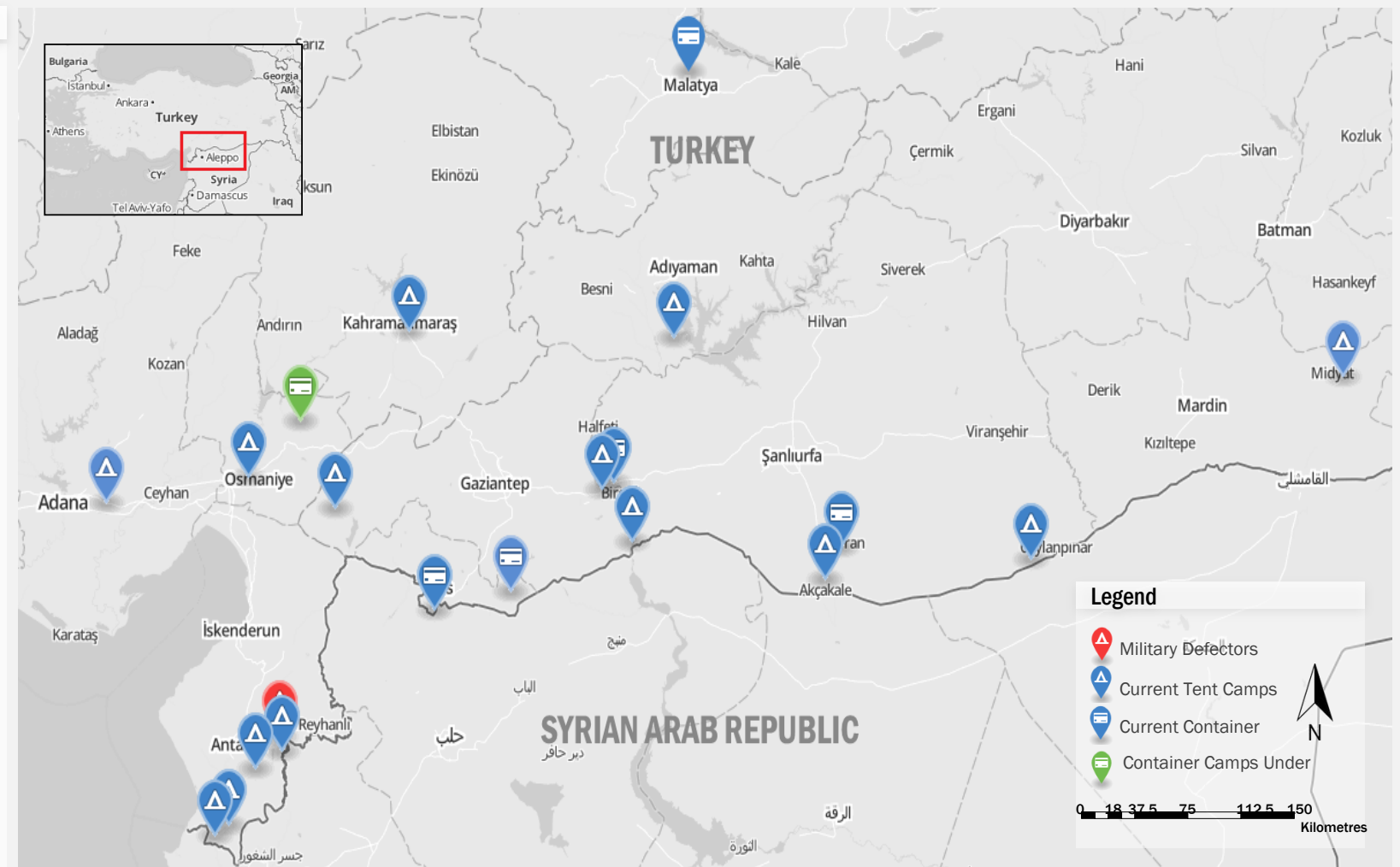

Highlights

- On 21 August 2013, AFAD - the Disaster and Emergency Management Agency of Government of Turkey - announced that the total number of Syrians registered and assisted in 20 camps in 10 provinces was 201,041, including 653 Syrians receiving medical treatment in hospitals. AFAD reported that during the last 24 hours, 817 Syrians were admitted and registered in the camps while 812 Syrians voluntarily returned to Syria.
- UNHCR Field Team met with the officials of the AFAD Coordination Center in Sanliurfa province. Reportedly as of 21 August 2013, AFAD Coordination Center in Sanliurfa registered more than 30,000 non-camp Syrians living in Sanliurfa province with its 10 towns and city center. According to the records, 43% reported Sanliurfa city center as their place of residence.
- Each of the registered Syrians are issued an individual ID card which they can use to have access to the medical assistance in the hospitals, in addition to the existing assistance mechanisms. Government Agency SASF -- Social Assistance and Solidarity Foundation -- and NGOs are given limited access to see the data base. All the registered families are visited by the SASF teams, which include social workers, who make recommendations for relevant assistance. While some families are provided cash assistance, other families are directly referred to NGOs. Reportedly the finger prints of the registered people are taken by police or gendarmerie will soon be integrated into the same software.
- Altinozu-1 (Tekel) camp manager informed UNHCR Team that a refugee representative team (7 persons) has been established. Reportedly the refugee representatives will be assisting the camp management to relay the requests and needs and when requested by the management, the refugee representatives will also assist in the distribution of any NFIs. In Altinozu -1 (Tekel) camp there are also some 10 Syrians who are employed by the management as cleaners, and one as assistant camp manager.
- Adiyaman camp officials informed UNHCR Team that they will receive 8,000 mattresses and 2,500 hygiene kits reportedly donated by the South Korean Government. The camp management also informed that they have received some 1,380 UNHCR tents from Kizilay and will replace the old ones before winter and will request enough to replace all the tents.
