







## Highlights

- On 17 September 2013, AFAD - the Disaster and Emergency Management Agency of Government of Turkey - announced that the total number of Syrians registered and assisted in 21 camps in 10 provinces was 200,049, including 730 Syrians receiving medical treatment in hospitals. AFAD reported that during the 24 hrs of 16-17 Sep 2013, a total of 354 Syrians were admitted and registered in the camps and 328 Syrians have voluntarily returned to Syria.
- It was reported in both the national and international media that a car bomb exploded on the Syrian side in Bab Al Hawa across Reyhanli Cilvegözü border gate. According to media and unofficial sources, 8 people died and some 20 were injured. UNHCR Field Team has been in close contact with the local officials and reportedly there has been no influx towards the Turkey border.
- In Mardin Midyat tent camp, officials informed UNHCR Field Team that the Provincial Directorate of Family and Social Policies Office in Mardin, conducted an assessment in all the tents in the camp to identify People with Special Needs (PSN). Reportedly some 39 persons have been identified with special needs, such as people with hearing and visual disabilities and mental disabilities. The assessment report of the Directorate was shared with the UNHCR Team. Reportedly it is recommended in the assessment report to establish special classes for these people with special needs.
- The Mardin Midyat camp management informed UNHCR Team that in order to respond the medical needs, 3 doctors are working in the camp while 4 more have been assigned but waiting for the completion of the paperwork to report to work. In addition to the 3 doctors, there is also 1 nurse, 2 midwives and one health worker available in the camp everyday.
- In Osmaniye, local authorities informed UNHCR that through the local muhtars and NGOs they have enumerated some 9,000 persons (1,700 families) non-camp Syrians living in the province of whom some 217 persons (83 families) were issued ikamets (residence permits) as they have passports.
