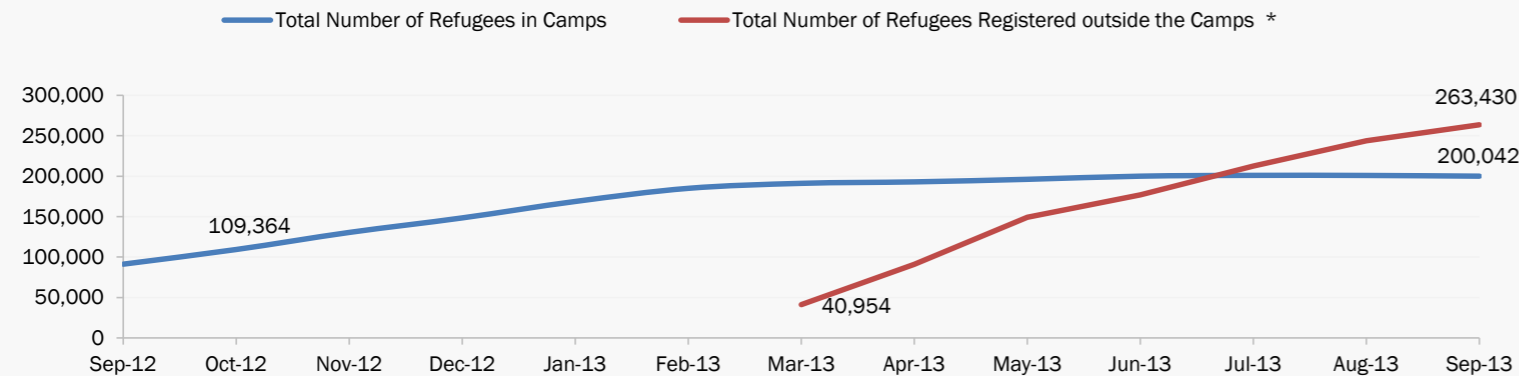
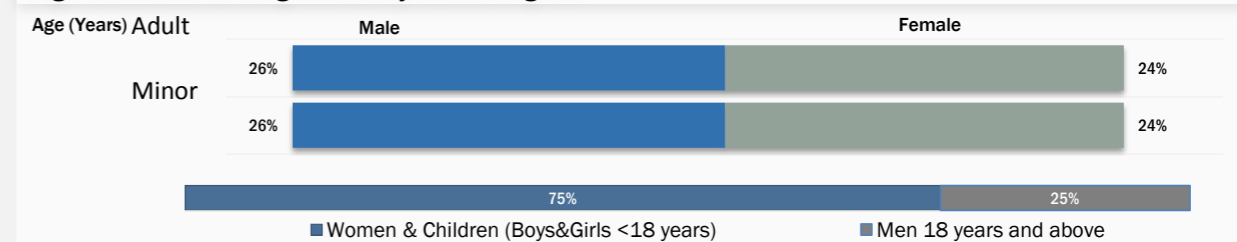

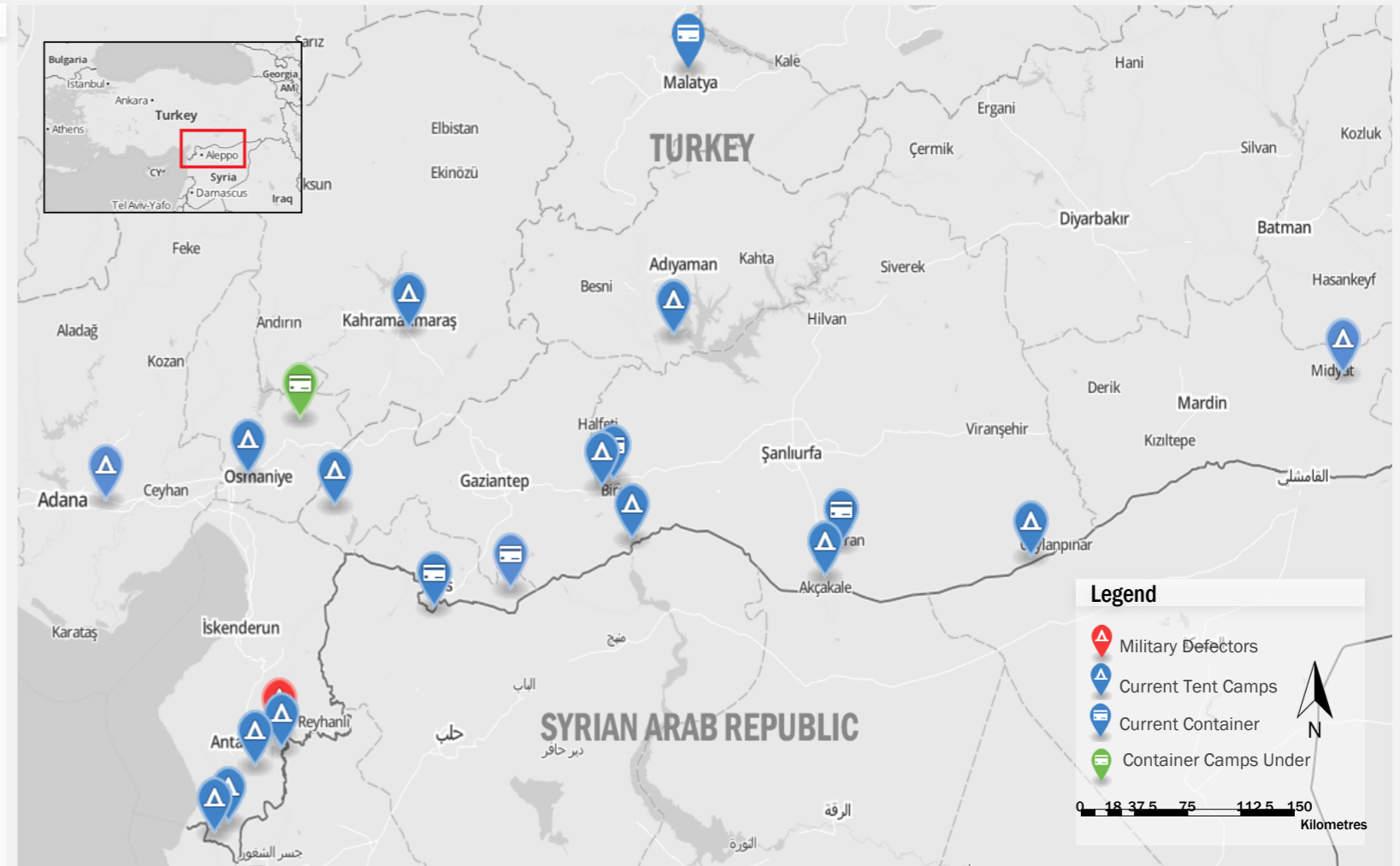


## Age & Gender of Registered Syrian Refugees



## Highlights

- On 25 September 2013, AFAD - the Disaster and Emergency Management Agency of Government of Turkey - announced that the total number of Syrians registered and assisted in 21 camps in 10 provinces was 200,042, including 651 Syrians receiving medical treatment in hospitals. AFAD reported that during the 24 hrs of 24-25 Sept. 2013, a total of 578 Syrians were admitted and registered in the camps and 561 Syrians have voluntarily returned to Syria.
- In Ceylanpinar, camp officials informed the UNHCR Field Team that the identification of those who are registered in the camp but live elsewhere is underway. When they are identified, they are de-registered from camp records and included in the urban population of the respective province, i.e: Mardin, Urfa, etc. Reportedly, last week (16-20 Sept. 2013) about 193 new arrivals were sent to the camp and all the new arrivals are registered and they will be issued ID cards when they are placed in their family tents. The officials informed UNHCR that there are 2,143 persons accommodated in communal tents and/or living with their relatives, pending placement in family tents due to the shortage of space.
- On the way to Adiyaman camp, a UNHCR Field Team met with a group of Syrians living in makeshift tents in the fields on the side of the road. The Syrians stated that there are about 7 families (about 60 persons) working in the fields and not willing to be placed in any of the camps. During the meetings with the local officials in Adiyaman, UNHCR Team was informed that there are only 202 Syrians living in urban areas in Adiyaman and its towns. Local police reported that out of 202 Syrians, 142 of them with passports were issued ikamets upon their application, and some 60 have been enumerated. Due to small number of non-camp Syrians in Adiyaman province, they have no plans to establish a Coordination Center.
- Local Foreigners police in the camps and urban informed UNHCR Field Teams that as per written instructions from Ministry of Interior (MOI) General Directorate of Security, Provincial Foreigners police departments are requested to establish Coordination Centers where non-camp Syrians can be registered. Reportedly, a letter on this issue was sent to 20 provincial governorates, including those where the 21 camps are established. The registration software will also have a module for finger printing and cross-checking within the registered database to avoid multiple registrations of the individuals.
- The first of 23 mobile registration centers donated by UNHCR to AFAD has been presented on 25 September in Ankara. In the coming three months the other 22 mobile centers will become operational and used in places where there are no structural registration centers.
