






## Age & Gender of Registered Syrian Refugees



## Highlights

- On 08 October 2013, AFAD - the Disaster and Emergency Management Agency of Government of Turkey - announced that the total number of Syrians registered and assisted in 21 camps in 10 provinces was 200,011 including 665 Syrians receiving medical treatment in hospitals. AFAD reported that during the 24hrs of 07-08 Oct. 2013, a total of 530 Syrians were admitted and registered in the camps and 526 Syrians have voluntarily returned to Syria.
- In Akcakale camp, the officials informed UNHCR Field Team that they have completed the registration of the Syrians (approx. 1,200) accommodated in the communal tent (so-called "waiting area"). These people have not yet been provided individual tents : they will be moved into family tents when they become available. In addition to these people, the camp management also started to register those who are called "invisibles": some 3,000 admitted to the camp as guests and living with their relatives. With these new registrations, the camp's population reached almost 27,000 which makes Akcakale camp the most populous camp among all 21 camps.
- In Nizip and Islahiye, UNHCR Field Team was informed by officials that about 1,000 non-camp Syrians living in Gaziantep who were identified as vulnerable and who can no longer afford to pay rent will be accepted in the camps. Reportedly the AFAD Coordination Center in Gaziantep has identified these Syrians among their registered caseload in Gaziantep province. Some 200-250 persons will be transferred to Nizip-1 camp and about 800 will be sent to Islahiye camp. In Islahiye the camp management informed UNHCR that they are planning to set-up an additional 70 tents to accommodate those who will be transferred from the Gaziantep urban areas.
- In Mardin, UNHCR Field team was informed by the foreigners police that spontaneous returns continue and the police is facilitating the exit of these people through the military-controlled exit point in Senturt near Kiziltepe. Reportedly, recently the police facilitated the exit of some 1,000 persons in a single day .
- In Sanliurfa, Social Assistance and Solidarity Foundation (SASF) of the Governorate informed UNHCR Field Team that they have provided assistance to some 1000 vulnerable Syrian families living outside of the camps in Sanliurfa province. Reportedly the Foundation provided about 600,000 TL to families identified as vulnerable among those who are registered by the AFAD Coordination Center after the social workers conducted house visits. The officials informed UNHCR Field Team that they have requested additional funds from the Government as they believe there are more families in need of assistance to pay their rents.
