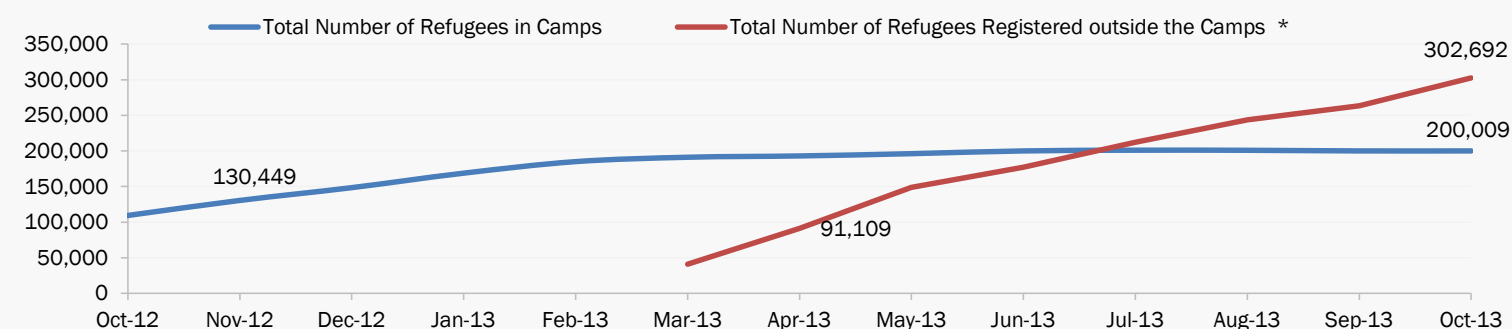
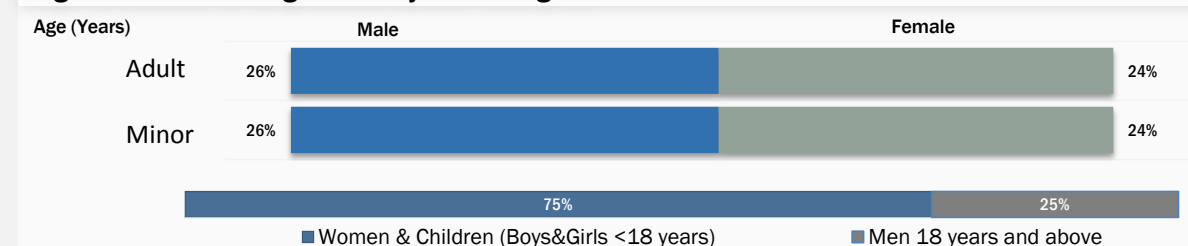

## Highlights

- On 10 October 2013, AFAD - the Disaster and Emergency Management Agency of Government of Turkey - announced that the total number of Syrians registered and assisted in 21 camps in 10 provinces was 200,009 including 100 Syrians receiving medical treatment in hospitals. AFAD reported that during the 24hrs of 09-10 Oct. 2013, a total of 650 Syrians were admitted and registered in the camps and 646 Syrians have voluntarily returned to Syria.
- In addition to allowing qualified Syrian doctors to work in the camps, the camp managements have been informed by the Ministry of Education that qualified Syrian teachers will also be allowed to work in the camps on voluntary basis, under the supervision of the Education Director. Reportedly the Curriculum that will be implemented in the schools will be prepared by Supreme Education Commission of the Syrian National Council but will be under the supervision of Ministry of Education.
- Upon request from the camp managements UNHCR provided 518 wheelchairs to 13 camps. The delivery of the wheelchairs has been completed during the week and the camp managements will distribute the wheelchairs to the disabled people in consultation with the camp doctor. Upon request more wheel chairs will be provided by UNHCR.
- In Ceylanpinar camp, the renovation of the tents is on going. All the tents will be replaced with UNHCR donated tents. AFAD and Kizilay are working together by moving the people of one district of the camp to the communal tents temporarily while replacing all the old tents. While doing this the camp's site planning set up is also revised and roads and walkways between the tents and districts are repaired. The UNHCR Team observed that similar renovation is also ongoing in Karkamis Camp and tents are being renewed gradually.
- Re-registration of the camp residents with the new registration database is on going and while doing this officials are also doing the finger printing. The new software which the camp residents are re-registered and fingerprinted, enables the authorities to discover the double registrations. The ID Cards are also renewed with the new registration data base.
- AFAD Sanliurfa informed UNHCR that about 300 vulnerable persons living in Akcakale town will be transferred to Ceylanpinar Camp. Reportedly an assessment was conducted and these families were identified to be living in difficult conditions so their transfer to Ceylanpinar camp will be done before the Eid.
