


Highlights

- On 22 October 2013, AFAD - the Disaster and Emergency Management Agency of Government of Turkey - announced that the total number of Syrians registered and assisted in 21 camps in 10 provinces was 200,027 including 88 Syrians receiving medical treatment in hospitals. AFAD reported that during the last 24hrs (21-22 Oct 2013), a total of 291 Syrians were admitted and registered in the camps and 296 Syrians have voluntarily returned to Syria.
- In Kahramanmaras Camp, officials informed UNHCR that as part of their winterization preparedness of last year, they had distributed 3,000 heaters in the camp. Since then some 1,000 of them have broken down and returned to the camp management, for repair and re-distribution to the camp residents. In addition to the heaters, the camp management also distributed coats, shoes (about 4,000 pairs) which they received as donation and also additional blankets will be given to the camp residents in the coming days. As there is a need for further winterization preparedness, UNHCR is currently procuring 2,000 heaters for the camps and is planning to procure for all the camps.
- The camp manager in Kahramanmaras informed UNHCR that they will continue the vocational courses and need more raw material for the products. Reportedly the products will be sold in cooperation with the Governorate and the income will be distributed among the trainees. The camp management is also planning to organize additional courses such as computer etc. With regards to the education, the camp management informed UNHCR that the current tents used for school have already exceeded the capacity and they are expecting 20 more tents of which 6 will be used for kindergartens.
- In Adiyaman, the UNHCR Team met with the members of the Human Rights Council of Adiyaman province. The Council is composed of members from NGOs, Bar Association, some selected Government Institutions as well as members from the political parties. Reportedly the Council visits the camp regularly and report on their observations.
- Camp officials in Ceylanpinar informed UNHCR that the renovation in the camp is still on-going and all tents are being replaced with new ones procured by UNHCR. Reportedly, some 20 tents burnt in the camp, but no casualties were reported. Although the reason of the fire is not known yet, it is suspected that some refugees deliberately burnt their tents in order to get their tents renewed immediately.
- Reportedly, a circular of Ministry of Education for the Syrian children allows Syrian teachers to work on voluntary basis. It is also reported that another circular was published allowing the Syrian doctors to work in the camps on a voluntary basis provided that necessary documents are certified by the Chamber of Doctors. UNHCR is seeking confirmation of these new measures taken.
