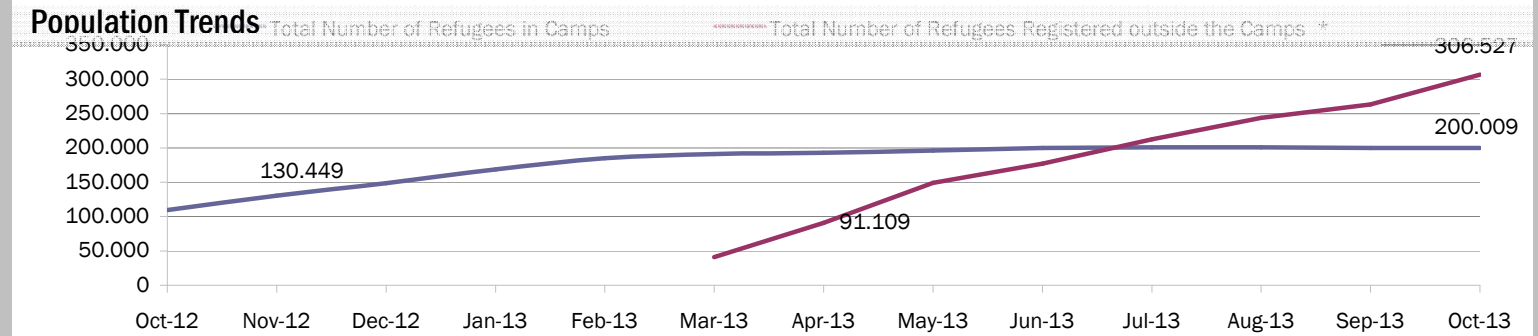
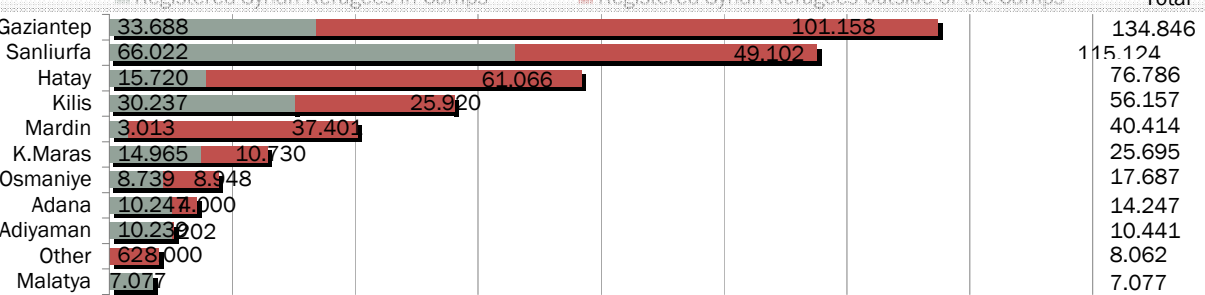


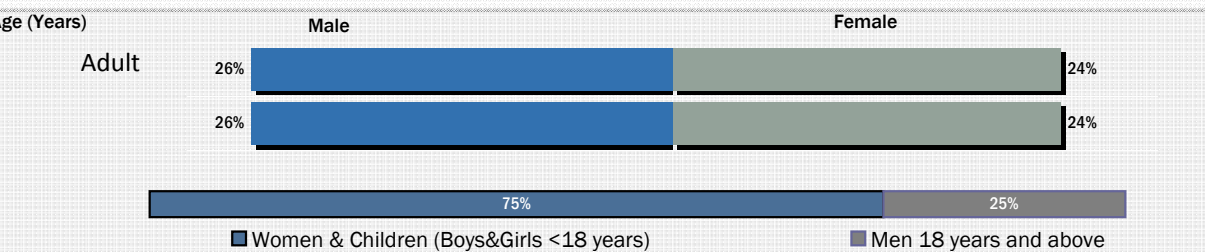

Highlights

- On 30 October 2013, AFAD - the Disaster and Emergency Management Agency of Government of Turkey - announced that the total number of Syrians registered and assisted in 21 camps in 10 provinces was 200,009 including 62 Syrians receiving medical treatment in hospitals. AFAD reported that during the 48hrs (29-30 Oct 2013), a total of 376 Syrians were admitted and registered in the camps and 372 Syrians have voluntarily returned to Syria.
- The registration of non-camp Syrians and the re-registration of the all the camp residents with the new software by the foreigners police is on going. While the process is completed in smaller sized camps, because of the technical challenges in some locations the process is relatively slower and the ID cards are issued after the registration which the beneficiaries are requested to approach to get them after a few days. In Sanliurfa province the police has not yet started to take over the registration therefore AFAD Coordination Center continues to register the non-camp Syrians. In Kilis, the foreigners police informed UNHCR that they families who were enumerated by AFAD are informed to approach the new center in city center to get registered. Reportedly some over 20,000 Syrians were enumerated by AFAD office in Kilis.
- In Nizip-1 camp the officials informed UNHCR that compared to previous year, they have an increased number of children registered to school (3,600 children) and in order to accommodate the children they are urgently in need of additional classes. The management also informed UNHCR that the vocational training items (sewing machines etc.) provided by UNHCR were all set in their places and are operational and the classes will start this week. In Islahiye the officials informed that they have 2,200 children registered to school however there are still about 890 children not yet registered but the registration process is still on going. UNHCR Field Team is in contact with the school manager and to conduct house visits through the social workers to encourage the families to register their children to school.
- On 29-30 October 2013, there was a demonstration in the Transit Center in Kilis which led to a riot by the Syrians who protested the conditions and requested to be transferred to a camp preferably a container site. Reportedly the situation is calmed down. UNHCR continues to discuss protection and assistance considerations with concerned authorities.
- The Public Centre established by Ministry of Family and Social Policies is opened in Islahiye town. There are six staff working at the center who will assist social workers in the camp and will organize hygiene sessions in the camp. UNHCR Team advised the social workers in the camp to inform camp residents about their presence during these sessions which will be organized by the staff of the Public Centre.
