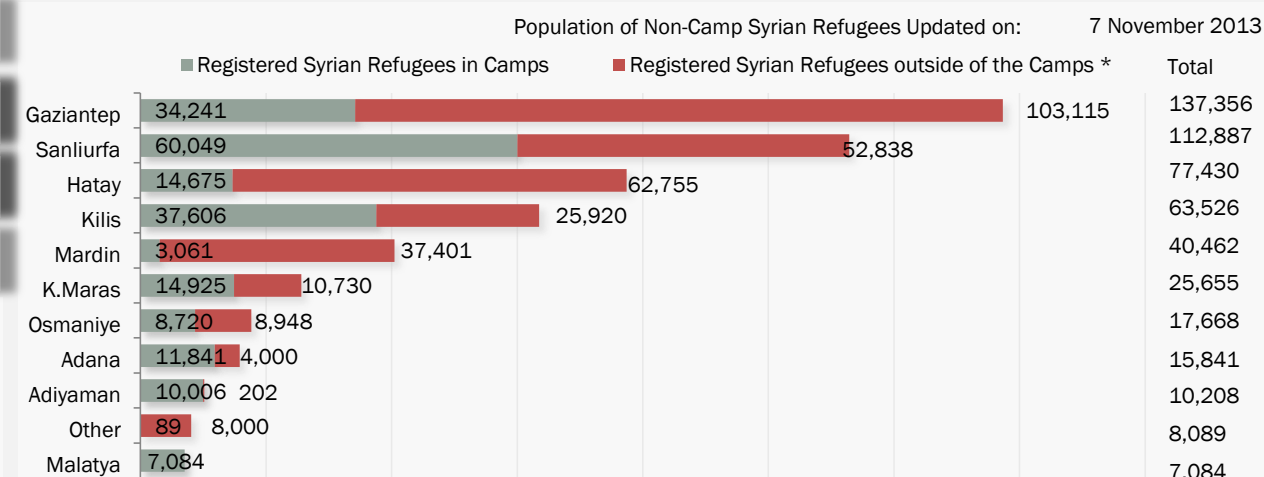
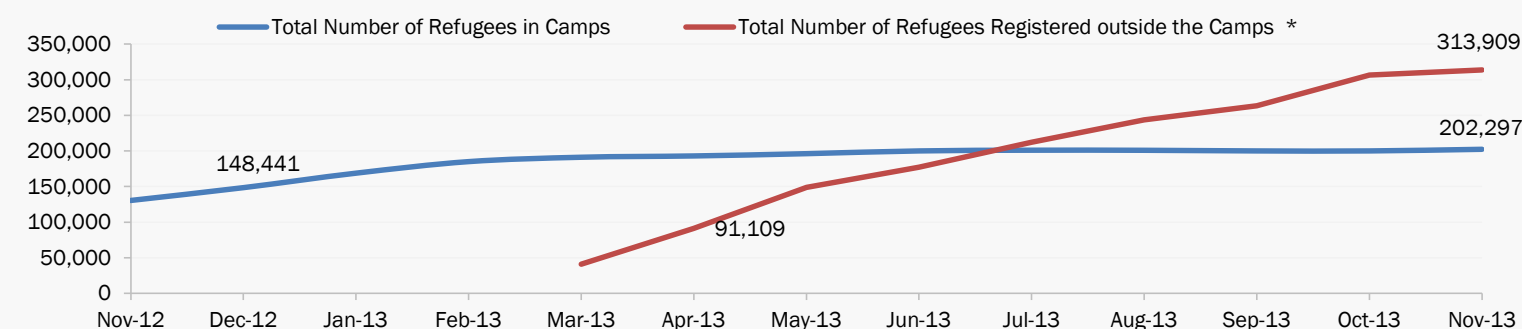

Highlights

- On 14 November 2013, AFAD - the Disaster and Emergency Management Agency of Government of Turkey - announced that the total number of Syrians registered and assisted in 21 camps in 10 provinces was 202,297 including 89 Syrians receiving medical treatment in hospitals. AFAD reported that during the 24hr of 14-15 Nov. 2013 a total of 324 Syrians were admitted and registered in the camps and 472 Syrians have voluntarily returned to Syria.
- UNHCR was informed by the Hatay Yayladagi 1 and 2 camp manager that they have received 1,100 kitchen cabinets provided by UNHCR and all have been distributed to the families in both camps in Yayladagi. UNHCR provided kitchen cabinets to all tented camps as well as kitchen sets, and fridges including the container sites.
- In Sanliurfa, local authorities informed UNHCR that the Governorate of Sanliurfa identified about 600 vulnerable non-camp Syrians through the Social Assistance and Solidarity Foundation. Reportedly, the Governorate will provide 500 kg of coal per family. UNHCR will discuss with the local officials to support their assistance and provide heaters to these families.
- UNHCR was informed by local officials in Kilis that about 100 families in the Transit Center have been transferred to Kilis Elbeyli Container Site and another 105 families will be transferred during the weekend. Reportedly the total is estimated to be about 1,450 persons. The officials informed that while selecting the families, they have given priority to the vulnerable families with disabled family members, women with children etc. The officials also informed that there will be some more admissions from Bab Al Salame as well. It is not yet clear how many will be admitted and when it will take place.
- During a mission to Ceylanpinar, a UNHCR Field Team met with 2 families who stated that are Assyrian origin and would like to return to Syria because of the conditions in the camp. The UNHCR Field Team counseled the families and proposed them the option of Mardin - Midyat camp. In consultation with the camp officials, the families accepted to be relocated to the Mardin Midyat Camp. The officials informed UNHCR that they will facilitated their transfer immediately.
