<p><b><u>1. Food sector activities (3W's)</u></b></p> <p><b><u>a. Activities within the RRP5:</u></b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>For the month of July, the food sector collectively distributed to over 401,191 registered Syrian refugees; 122,141 beneficiaries through dry rations in addition to daily bread, 6,483 new arrivals through welcome meals, 3,976 students through the school feeding in Al Za'atri camp and 268,591 beneficiaries through value-based food vouchers in Jordanian communities, along with <u>2,500</u> unregistered refugees</li> <li>The UNHCR proposed RRP5 monthly reporting template for the food sector was presented to the members – to be circulated for comments</li> <li>With the low influx of Syrian refugees, the question of whether the RRP5 planning figure of 1 million refugees by the end of December 2013 is as realistic as it seemed earlier this year. It is important to agree on how the humanitarian community should go about responding to this question, especially coming from donors. WFP will seek guidance from Inter-Cluster Coordinator/HCT.</li> </ul>	<p>Food Sector members to submit monthly updates on RRP5 achievements</p> <p>Circulate UNHCR proposed RRP5 monthly reporting template for comments</p>

Food Sector Gender Marker Training – GenCap</u></b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>In follow-up to the Gender in Humanitarian Action training conducted in June 2013, a sector specific training will be conducted to the food sector on the Gender Marker</li> <li>Training will be conducted by the nominated food sector gender focal points from Islamic Relief and WFP with support from GenCap (Merrin Waterhouse)</li> <li>Tentative training date: 11 September 2013 for 2.5 hours at the WFP Amman office</li> </ul>	<p>Circulate invitation e-mail regarding the gender marker training</p>
<p><b><u>5. Nutrition programme updates:</u></b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>WFP is launching its Nutrition Programme for the implementation of the MAM treatment programme in both the local community and camp setting, targeting CU5 and PLW in early October 2013. Call for proposals has been circulated.</li> </ul>
