

Highlights

- On 05 December 2013, AFAD - the Disaster and Emergency Management Agency of Government of Turkey - announced that the total number of Syrians registered and assisted in 21 camps in 10 provinces was 205,852 including 167 Syrians receiving medical treatment in hospitals. AFAD reported that during the 24hrs of (04-05 Dec. 2013) 111 Syrians were admitted and registered in the camps and 198 Syrians have voluntarily returned to Syria.
- UNHCR was informed by the camp management in Harran that the sub-governor will assign a woman as deputy camp manager. Reportedly the new deputy camp manager will be in direct contact with the female camp residents on women issues also making use of the women's committee that will be established. Upon request from the camp management on UNHCR's support and advice, UNHCR will be present during the election and appointment of the women's committee members.
- While the renovation is ongoing in Ceylanpinar camp, the camp management is temporarily accommodating camp residents in large rub hall tents until their tents are replaced. In the mean time there are also about 1,300 people accommodated in the waiting area in the rub halls. During the visit to the camp on Thursday, UNHCR observed that heavy rains damaged some of the rub-hall tents in the waiting area. Local officials and camp management have been in close contact with central officials to solve the issue, including to move some of these residents to Viranshir camp. In the meantime until the decision is made for their relocation to Viranshir the affected tents are being replaced.
- In Akcakale camp, one of the electricity transformers exploded due to excessive use of power on electrical outlets (heaters, fridges, cooking sets etc.). There were no casualties and one damaged tent was replaced. The camp management informed that they will take necessary measures such as moving the tents away from the transformers and advise the residents about safe electricity use.
- The President of Turkey Mr. Abdullah Gul visited Kilis Elbeyli camp and commended the local community in Kilis town for their hospitality and tolerance to the Syrian refugees. Kilis province currently hosts more Syrian refugees than local population. On Friday 06 Dec. 2013, President Gul met with representatives of UN Agencies (UNHCR, WFP, UNICEF, WHO, UNFPA, UNDP and OCHA) and IOM operational in SE Turkey within Syria Emergency. Among other issues discussed, UNHCR congratulated the President for the adoption by the Turkish parliament last April of the law on Foreigners and International Protection while being in the midst of a major refugee influx. UNHCR commended Turkey's response and stressed that as part of the call for international solidarity it calls upon all countries, and not only neighboring countries, to open their borders to Syrian refugees; and on the need for visa lifting or visa liberalization for Syrians in particular in case of family reunification.
