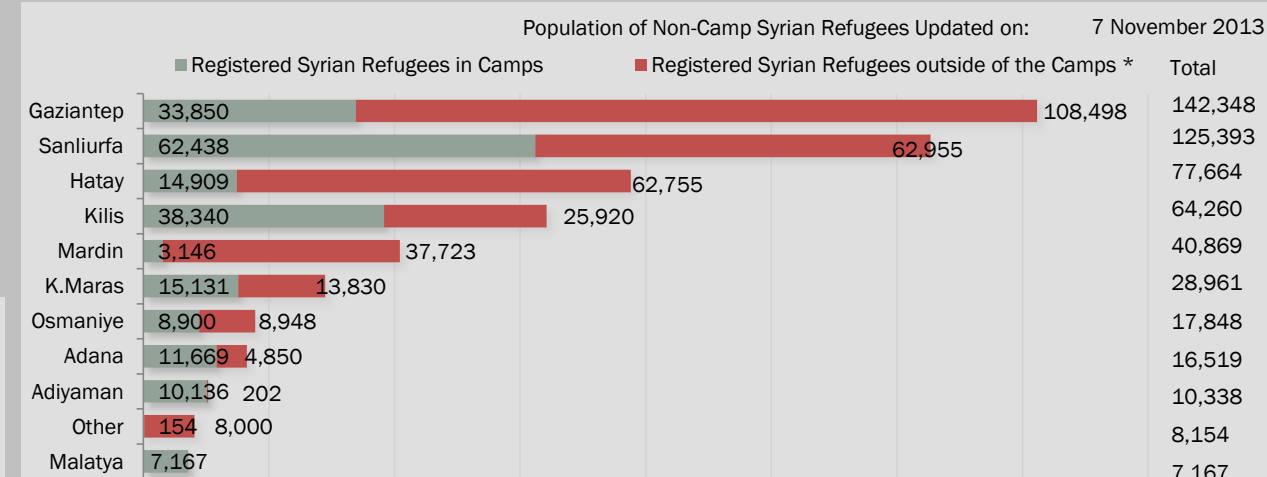
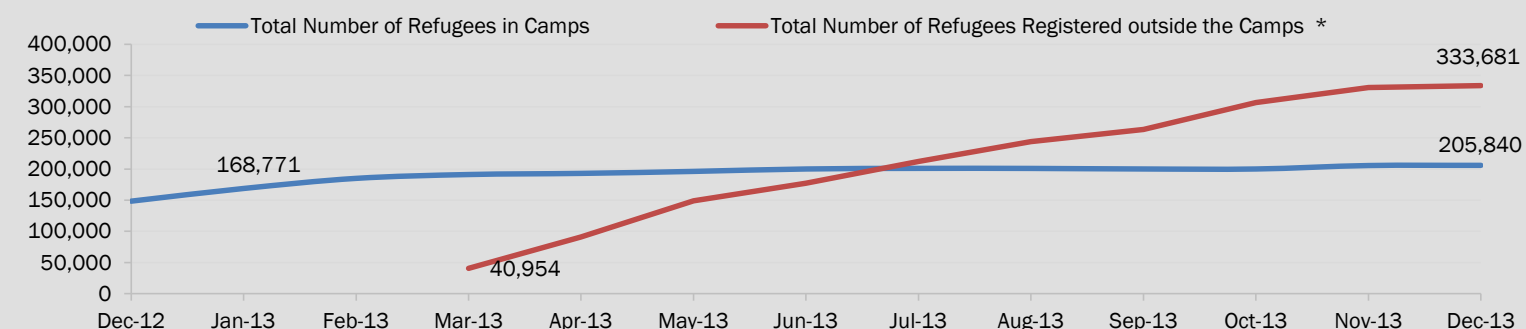

Highlights

- On 09 December 2013, AFAD - the Disaster and Emergency Management Agency of Government of Turkey - announced that the total number of Syrians registered and assisted in 21 camps and one transit center in 10 provinces was 205,840 including 154 Syrians receiving medical treatment in hospitals. AFAD reported that during the 24 hrs. of 08-09 Dec. 2013, a total of 289 Syrians were admitted and registered in the camps and 449 Syrians have voluntarily returned to Syria.
- After opening of the camp in Viransehir, the number of camps with residents is now 21, of which 6 are container sites and the others are tented camps. In addition to 21 camps, there is also a transit center in Kilis which has 99 containers and 23 rub hall tents.
- On 09 Dec. 2013, AFAD reported that 755 Syrians are accommodated in Viransehir camp which opened during the weekend. To tackle overcrowding in the Kilis transit center, the first transfers to Viransehir camp came from this center. UNHCR team learned from Viransehir camp officials that in addition to 755 persons, on Monday 09 Dec. about 300 more Syrians were transferred to Viransehir camp from the waiting area in Akcakale camp. The officials in Viransehir camp stated that the transfers will continue during the week both the waiting areas in Akcakale and Ceylanpinar camps, as well as some IDPs in Bab Al Salame. Reportedly the police will start registration during the week.
- In Kilis local police conducting the registration of the non-camp Syrians living in Kilis city center, informed UNHCR that the registration of about 9,500 Syrians (about 1,300 families) has been completed. Reportedly AFAD previously enumerated some more than 25,000 Syrians living in Kilis city center and while the registrations will continue, the police also issues 500 ID cards per day to those who have been registered.
- In Gaziantep, local officials informed that the number of non-camp Syrians registered reached over 90,000 of whom only about 10% have so far been re-registered by police within the new registration software. It was also reported by local officials that there are about 5,000 Syrians who have been issued temporary residence permits (Ikamets) in Gaziantep province.
