


Highlights

- On 19 December 2013, AFAD the Disaster and Emergency Management Agency of Government of Turkey - announced that the total number of Syrians registered and assisted in 21 camps in 10 provinces was 208,219 including 184 Syrians receiving medical treatment in hospitals. AFAD reported that during the 48 hours of 18-19 Dec 2013, a total of 298 Syrians were admitted and registered in the camps and 333 Syrians have voluntarily returned to Syria. There is no one in the Kilis transit center.
- In Mardin, a private business person donated 300,000 Turkish Lira to distribute among the camp residents (100 TL per person). The camp officials also stated that they had identified about 12 school age children outside the camp to be registered in the camp school.
- In Harran container camp, 15 Syrian volunteers will be working in the camp hospital as support staff to the health team. Reportedly when needed, these volunteers will be providing services on light injuries, and dressing of wounds.
- During the visit to Nizip-1 tent camp, officials informed that they are working on installing 10 more latrines in the camp designed for the people with special needs (PSN). Reportedly a private business person from Gaziantep visited the camp and discussed with the camp management support to camp projects. The management provided the list of persons with special needs (121) with their disabilities.
- UNHCR Field Teams were informed by camp officials that they have distributed blankets received from Kizilay (Turkish Red Crescent Society - TRCS). Reportedly, 10,000 blankets were distributed in Akcakale, and another 7,000 in Islahiye. It was also reported that UNFPA has provided over 47,000 hygiene kits to all camps, and an additional 7,895 kits have been stored in Kizilay warehouse for future needs.
- In Ceylanpinar, the women's committee had their first meeting on 19 Dec. 2013. A UNHCR Team was also present in the meeting. Upon suggestion from the UNHCR Team, the camp management will provide ID cards to the committee members as well a separate space in the camp for committee meetings.
